SAVA POOL TO OPEN YEAR AHEAD OF SCHEDULE!



Most of you will be happy to hear that Sava Pool, which is currently undergoing a renovation, is slated for completion nearly a year ahead of schedule.

When Sava Pool opened at 19th Avenue and Wawona Street in the 1950s, Sunset District families flocked to it, making it the most popular pool in the City. Fifty years later, time and use had taken its toll, and Sava Pool closed in June 2007 for what was expected to be a 30-month rebuild.

Construction of the pool, which cost nearly \$17 million, is expected to end in November. The pool opening is slated for this December.

The new Sava Pool is new in every sense of the word. There are brand new locker rooms, showers and restrooms, as well

as a new multipurpose room for parties and gatherings. The old pool had six 33-yard lanes, but the new pool has eight 25-yard lanes to meet regulation size and allows for the expansion of programs at the pool.

The pool was constructed with conservation in mind. Through a partnership with the SFPUC, the pool water will be partially heated through solar panels on the roof. The wall of windows on the south side of the building provide the facility with natural light.

General admission to the pool is the same as all public pools in the City -- \$1.00 for children under 17 years and \$4.00 for adults.

I know that our children and families are ready to jump back into Sava Pool, which has served as an invaluable community center for nearly six decades already. Sava Pool will soon continue to serve as the place where our children learn to swim and where families recreate for generations to come.

GREENING THE SUNSET - OCTOBER 18TH

This is a reminder that the Sunset's largest greening event – Dig It! – is happening on **Saturday, October 18**th, where almost 200 trees will be planted in our community. Dig It! will be one of the largest community events in San Francisco this year! Volunteers are asked to show up at **8:00AM at West Sunset Playground (38**th **Ave & Ortega)**. Breakfast will be provided. Volunteers will help plant trees, clean up playgrounds (West Sunset Playground, South Sunset Playground and Sunset Playground), as well as pick up litter and clear walking paths along Sunset Boulevard. At the end of the work day, all volunteers will reconvene at West Sunset Playground for a celebration that will include lunch, guest speakers and prizes. The first 400 volunteers will receive a free ticket to a concert that evening and a special Timberland t-shirt commemorating the achievement of the day. Our office worked with the Department of Public Works to secure \$100,000 in grant money for tree planting along Sunset Boulevard. CLEANING & PAVING NORIEGA STREET



We are happy to announce that Noriega Street was recently added as part of the Community Corridors Program after we received neighborhood input for additional cleaning efforts in our district. The program includes a designated corridor Ambassador to monitor street cleanliness and initiate cleaning efforts, as well as steam cleaning for the streets. Irving and Taraval will continue receiving regular cleaning services as existing streets under the program.

Noriega Street, between 35th Avenue – Great Highway, will also undergo the Noriega Pavement Renovation Project and is slated to begin in early December. The project includes sewer replacement and is expected to cost \$3.5 million.

BUILDING A PLAYGROUND AND BUILDING COMMUNITY



Over the past year, our office has been working closely with the Friends of West Sunset Playground (FOWSP) to help raise money to rebuild West Sunset Playground at 38th Avenue and Ortega. On October 2nd, FOWSP hosted a Sunset Soiree at City Hall to generate awareness for the playground rebuild effort, where over 100 community members came to learn more about how to help. Students from Sunset Elementary School and AP Giannini Middle School also attended to share why they felt the playground is in need of a makeover.

Our office has helped secure \$15,000 in grant money to kick-start this fundraising effort, and we thank all the community members and companies that have donated to the playground already.
