Reference Services – provided by Attorney Librarians

- Comprehensive knowledge of legal resources in electronic, print & Internet formats
- Guidance in the effective use of difficult to understand, constantly changing legal topics, practices & procedures
- Legal database training
- Referrals to other agencies
- Locate the best resources to meet users' individual legal needs
- Frame research strategies for complex issues for legal practitioners, agencies & courts

- Update & develop new reference tools, sources & webpage links
- Assist in the use of Library resources
- Instruction for non-lawyers about the legal system & processes
- Obtain outside resources not available to individuals or firms





Extensive Electronic Collection – Free use of legal databases

- Expensive databases not available for free in other libraries or online
- Westlaw
- LexisNexis
- CEB OnLaw: CA practice materials such as criminal, family law, probate, business & employment law, real estate, civil litigation
- HeinOnline: legal journals, Federal Register, legislative history materials, government documents; the Library replaced its print journals with HeinOnline
- Dissomaster: child & family support calculation program
- Nolo Legal Reference Information Center: legal forms, e-books for nonlawyers
- Martin Dean's Essential Legal Forms: fill-out, print CA, SF court & other forms on the Library's public computers
- Plus many more databases & electronic resources

- Written by lawyers to assist non-lawyers in understanding legal issues
- Print and electronic formats
- Users can complete forms, legal documents & print out in Library

Divorce Without Court

- Collections Available Only at the Law Library
 - Frequently required by City departments, the public & law firms
 - Very rare San Francisco Municipal Code archive containing older Charters and municipal codes
 - California Administrative Registers for the CA Code of Regulations back to 1945 when they were created (online sources only from 2002)
 - Archival California Building Codes and previous editions of Uniform Building Codes, not available online
- Legal Education Programs & Seminars for the Public & Legal Practitioners



- Continuing Legal Education Materials (MCLE) in CD format
- Resource Sharing with Consortiums to Save Costs & Expand Resources



- Comprehensive California, San Francisco & Federal Legal Collection
 - Using the latest technologies & print resources
 - Constantly updated with the most recent laws, court decisions & developing legal trends
 - Statutes, codes, administrative regulations, case reports & agency rulings
 - Practice and how-to guides on various legal subjects, such as court procedures, legal transactions, drafting legislation, municipal corporations law
