Record Number of Votes for Supervisor Yee's District 7 Participatory Budgeting

District 7 residents came out in record numbers to vote for this year's Participatory Budgeting. Participatory Budgeting allows people who live, work, and play in District 7 to submit proposals for neighborhood improvement projects. District 7 residents then decide which proposals will be ultimately funded through a voting process. This year, Supervisor Norman Yee was the only supervisor to secure funds for this completely community-driven process. In total, more than 11,000 votes were cast for all proposals.

\$75,000 Proposal

- Renewed Area Celebrating West Portal's Past, Present, and Future
 - o West Portal Elementary will revitalize its largest schoolyard to become part of a recreation complex with adjacent West Portal Park. Improvements include a mural celebrating West Portal's history, resurfacing the yard with safety surface, painted running track and ball courts, new basketball goals, seating, and sun shades.

Pedestrian Safety/ Vision Zero

- Street Striping in Crosswalks and School Zones- \$50,000
 - To increase pedestrian visibility 10 School Zones and heavy pedestrian MUNI transfer locations will be reviewed. In order to increase pedestrian visibility up to 10 intersections will be converted from the existing standard crosswalks markings to the continental
- Pedestrian Safety Enhancements along Vicente & Ulloa between Funston Ave & Claremont-\$25.000.
- Pedestrian Safety Enhancements on Monterey & Plymouth \$25,000
- Miraloma School Student Safety- \$15,000
 - Traffic study and calming implementation including speed hump or alternative around Miraloma Elementary

Neighborhood Services

- Activate Ocean Avenue- \$15,000
 - o Funding for additional community events and entertainment along Ocean Avenue including the expansion of Second Sundays and promotion of local merchants.
- Emergency Preparedness & Recovery for Miraloma Park Community & Seniors -\$25,000
 - Funding to purchase basic equipment for 4 Service Areas in District 7 and 1 NERT Staging Area to be activated in a disaster including: 5 propane generators, 11 pop-up tents, and 10 HAM radios. For seniors: 100 LED lanterns, 100 "Go Kits", and 2 collapsible Wheelchairs.

Celebrating 100-Year Anniversary of West Portal Campaign-\$25,000

o Increasing West Portal's visibility and public appeal with advertising, events, and a map/ directory that showcase all the wonderful shops, restaurants, and businesses in the neighborhood and to host a community street event with a celebration

Sunnyside Park Landscape Enclosures- \$25,000

 Located on a steep hillside and surrounded by homes, this project will replace original rotting natural materials with permanent metal. These "gentle reminders" encourage plant growth, alleviates intrusive viewing downhill into backyards, and assist in efforts to control erosion on an uphill slope

Stonestown Capital Improvement Grant for senior services- \$25,000

 Will increase nutrition based social services including expanding take home meals programs, on-site lunches, nutritional/ healthy cooking demonstrations, and program space for cooking camps for youth.

• Connecting Youth to nature in the City's Green Hairstreak Corridor - \$18,800

Nature in the City will restore butterfly habitat at a brand new site at 14th Avenue and Rivera Street and present a two-day Green Hairstreak Butterfly Festival with Hoover Middle School, Kids in Parks, and San Francisco State University.

- West Portal Elementary Neighborhood Green Picnic Pavilion and Play Yard- \$25,000
- Commodore Sloat Community Playground Renovation-\$23,000
- Laguna Honda Boulevard Mural- \$25,000
- Community Book Shares to Promote Community and Literacy \$5,000
 - O Community book shares in the form of little free libraries will be installed in front of willing households and community centers with their goal to create a community-based, self-sufficient project.
