Conference with City Attorney

[Convene in Closed Session - Anticipated Litigation - City as Plaintiff and/or Defendant] Motion that the Budget and Finance Committee of the Board of Supervisors convene in closed session with the City Attorney for the purpose of conferring with, or receiving advice from, the City Attorney regarding settlement of anticipated litigation to be filed by Skyline Stables Corporation. Government Code Section 54956.9(b) and San Francisco Administrative Code Section 67.10(d)(2) permit this closed session because discussion in open session concerning this matter would likely and unavoidably prejudice the position of the City in the anticipated litigation.

6. 101357 [Settlement of Unlitigated Claims - Skyline Stables Corporation - \$650,000] Sponsor: Avalos

Resolution approving the settlement of the unlitigated claims by and between Skyline Stables Corporation (Skyline) and City and County of San Francisco, related to the lease between Skyline and the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) of a portion of the SFPUC Harry Tracy Water Treatment Plant (HTWTP) site in San Mateo County, the SFPUC approval of the HTWTP Long Term Improvement Project to improve water service reliability and seismic stability of the HTWTP, the SFPUC termination of Skyline's lease and Skyline's vacation of the lease premises, and SFPUC's offer to acquire the leasehold interest, calling for SFPUC to pay \$650,000 to Skyline, and including other material terms and conditions in a settlement and release agreement.

LEGISLATION UNDER THE 30-DAY RULE

(Not to be considered at this meeting)

Rule 5.40 provides that when an ordinance or resolution is introduced which would CREATE OR REVISE MAJOR CITY POLICY, the committee to which the legislation is assigned shall not consider the legislation until at least thirty days after the date of introduction. The provisions of this rule shall not apply to the routine operations of the departments of the City or when a legal time limit controls the hearing timing. In general, the rule shall not apply to hearings to consider subject matter when no legislation has been presented, nor shall the rule apply to resolutions which simply URGE action to be taken.

There are no items currently pending under the 30 day rule.

Meeting Procedures

The Board of Supervisors is the legislative body of the City and County of San Francisco. The Board has several standing committees where ordinances and resolutions are the subject of hearings at which members of the public are urged to testify. The full Board does not hold a second public hearing on measures which have been heard in committee.

Board procedures do not permit: 1) persons in the audience to vocally express support or opposition to statements by Supervisors or by other persons testifying; 2) ringing and use of cell phones, pagers, and similar sound-producing electronic devices; 3) bringing in or displaying signs in the meeting room; 4) standing in the meeting room.
