LEGISLATION UNDER THE 30-DAY RULE

(Not to be considered at this meeting)

Rule 5.40 provides that when an ordinance or resolution is introduced which would CREATE OR REVISE MAJOR CITY POLICY, the committee to which the legislation is assigned shall not consider the legislation until at least thirty days after the date of introduction. The provisions of this rule shall not apply to the routine operations of the departments of the City or when a legal time limit controls the hearing timing. In general, the rule shall not apply to hearings to consider subject matter when no legislation has been presented, nor shall the rule apply to resolutions which simply URGE action to be taken.

Ordinance amending: (1) the San Francisco Business and Tax Regulations Code by: (a) repealing Sections 6.11-4, 6.14-1, and 6.18-4 and amending Sections 6.1-1, 6.2-8, 6.2-9, 6.2-13, 6.2-15, 6.2-17, 6.2-18, 6.2-21, 6.4-1, 6.5-2, 6.6-1, 6.7-1, 6.7-2, 6.8-1, 6.9-1, 6.9-2, 6.9-3, 6.9-4, 6.9-5, 6.10-1, 6.10-2, 6.10-3, 6.11-1, 6.11-2, 6.11-3, 6.12-2, 6.12-5, 6.13-1, 6.13-3, 6.13-5, 6.13-6, 6.15-1, 6.15-2, 6.15-3, 6.15-4, 6.16-1, 6.17-1, 6.17-2, 6.17-3, 6.17-4, 6.18-1, 6.18-2, 6.18-3, 6.18-5, 6.19-1, 6.19-3, 6.19-4, 6.19-5, 6.19-6, 6.19-9, 6.21-1, and 6.22-1 of Article 6 (Common Administrative Provisions), to eliminate inconsistent and superseded cross-references, prohibit an operator from engaging in business without a certificate of authority, require annual renewal of a certificate of authority to collect third-party taxes, authorize the Tax Collector to revoke an operator's business registration certificate and certificate of authority for failure to collect and remit taxes, failure to comply with specific provisions of the Business and Tax Regulations Code and Police Code, failure to install and maintain revenue control equipment, or refusal to comply with the direction regarding trust accounts, increase bond requirements for parking station operators, authorize the Tax Collector to issue a deficiency determination or jeopardy determination against a parking operator's bond surety, deem the filing an incomplete tax return failure to file a return, clarify that a tax exempt entity is not relieved from its existing duty to collect and remit third-party taxes, require that within 15 days after the cessation of business each taxpayer file a return for the period, eliminate the use of estimated prepayments and instead require hotel and parking operators to remit the actual tax owed each month, permit the Tax Collector to independently determine the taxpayer's estimated tax liability for purposes of making a prepayment, increase the threshold amount for small firm prepayments from \$2,500 to \$3,750 establish the "pooled rate" as the applicable rate of interest on cash security returned to a taxpayer, provide for service of notice of a tax delinguency or determination on anyone in the State of California. clarify the date by which a deficiency determination must be served on a taxpayer, permit the Tax Collector to seek summary judgment immediately upon serving notice of a jeopardy determination on the taxpayer, establish the security necessary to stay enforcement of a jeopardy assessment, provide that any ground that is not asserted in the taxpayer's petition for redetermination is deemed waived in a later judicial proceeding to collect the specified tax, establish the procedure for increasing the amount of a determination, specify that in order to exhaust administrative remedies prior to seeking judicial relief taxpayer must state all grounds supporting redetermination in its petition to the Tax Collector and the Claim for Refund must be denied or deemed denied, clarify the proper party to seek a tax refund, provides for interest to the date of the refund if a refund is applied toward a future liability, clarify the statute of limitations period for filing suit if no notice that the Claim has been denied is served on the Taxpayer, clarify that a refund action is the only judicial remedy available to an aggrieved taxpayer, increase penalties for failure to file a return, clarify the law that determines the interest rate and enforcement procedures for summary judgments, include additional costs in the cost to enforce judgments, authorize the Tax Collector to seek an injunction to prohibit a person from doing business without a certificate of authority or business registration certificate, add additional violations, increase penalty amounts, and amend the procedure for issuing administrative citations, increase the maximum penalty amount imposed by administrative citation from \$5,000 to \$25,000 annually, authorize the Tax Collector to share taxpayer information with other public agencies for appropriate purposes, and reword various sections without substantive change; (b) amending Sections 604 of Article 9 (Tax on Occupancy of Parking Space in Parking Stations), 713 of Article 10 (Utility Users Tax), and 859 of Article 12 (Business Registration), to lengthen the time period that service suppliers must preserve records from 4 years to 5 years, and reword various sections without substantive change; (c) repealing Sections 608 through 608.8 of Article 9 (Tax on Occupancy of Parking Space in Parking Stations); and (2) the San Francisco Administrative Code by amending Section 10.80-2 of Article XIII (Funds), Chapter 10 (Finance, Taxation, and Other Fiscal Matters), to correct references to the California Government Code.

Ordinance amending Article 22 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code by amending Sections 2201 through 2210, 2215, 2216, 2218, 2220, 2225, 2226, 2229, 2230, 2232, 2233, and repealing Sections 2217, 2223, 2224, and 2237, to establish a presumption that certain operators, signatories and owners control the business affairs of the parking station; revise the Enforcing Agency's authority to permit the use of all authority granted by law and by Article 6 of this Code; and making other nonsubstantive changes.
