LEGISLATION UNDER THE 30-DAY RULE

(Not to be considered at this meeting)

Rule 5.40 provides that when an ordinance or resolution is introduced which would CREATE OR REVISE MAJOR CITY POLICY, the committee to which the legislation is assigned shall not consider the legislation until at least thirty days after the date of introduction. The provisions of this rule shall not apply to the routine operations of the departments of the City or when a legal time limit controls the hearing timing. In general, the rule shall not apply to hearings to consider subject matter when no legislation has been presented, nor shall the rule apply to resolutions which simply URGE action to be taken.

100922 [Authorizing the Department of Public Health to Enter Into Contracts for Out-of-County Behavioral Health Services in the Foster Care System] Sponsor: Mayor

Ordinance amending the San Francisco Administrative Code by amending Section 21.42 to authorize the Department of Public Health to contract for behavioral health services to children in the foster care system under the jurisdiction of the City and County of San Francisco and located outside of San Francisco, utilizing contracting language and forms mandated by the State of California under California Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5777.7.

101009 [Healthy Air and Clean Transportation Program] Sponsor: Mayor

Ordinance (1) amending the San Francisco Environment Code by repealing current Sections 400 through 409, and adopting new Sections 400 through 424; (2) amending the San Francisco Environment Code by amending current Sections 410, 411, and 421 and re-numbering them as Sections 425, 426, and 427 respectively; and (3) amending the San Francisco Administrative Code by amending Section 4.10-1, all to establish and implement a new Healthy Air and Clean Transportation Program, providing for the gradual conversion of the City's vehicle fleet to clean air vehicles and the gradual reduction of the overall number of passenger vehicles and light duty trucks in the City's vehicle fleet by 20 percent; and making environmental findings.

Ordinance amending the San Francisco Environment Code by amending Section 1702, to clarify the definition of "checkout bag" and other terms; adding Section 1703.5, to require stores to add a Green Bag Charge of 5 cents if they provide a customer with a disposable, single-use checkout bag, and making environmental findings.

Ordinance amending the San Francisco Environment Code by amending Section 1702, to extend the mandatory use of recyclable and compostable checkout bags from supermarkets and chain pharmacies, currently covered by Chapter 17, to all retail establishments in the City, and clarify the definitions of "checkout bag," "recyclable paper bag," and "reusable bag," setting an operative date of March 1, 2011, and making environmental findings.

101071 [Zoning - Temporary Uses and Mobile Food Facilities] Sponsor: Dufty

Ordinance amending the San Francisco Planning Code by adding Section 102.31 to define a Mobile Food Facility, amending Section 205 and adding Section 205.4 to establish a new category of temporary uses, and amending Sections 212, 790.91, 790.93, and 890.90 to clarify that Mobile Food Facilities need not be conducted within enclosed buildings; adopting findings, including environmental findings and findings of consistency with the General Plan and Planning Code Section 101.1.

Board procedures do not permit: 1) persons in the audience to vocally express support or opposition to statements by Supervisors or by other persons testifying; 2) ringing and use of cell phones, pagers, and similar sound-producing electronic devices; 3) bringing in or displaying signs in the meeting room; 4) standing in the meeting room.
