LEGISLATION UNDER THE 30-DAY RULE

(Not to be considered at this meeting)

Rule 5.40 provides that when an ordinance or resolution is introduced which would CREATE OR REVISE MAJOR CITY POLICY, the committee to which the legislation is assigned shall not consider the legislation until at least thirty days after the date of introduction. The provisions of this rule shall not apply to the routine operations of the departments of the City or when a legal time limit controls the hearing timing. In general, the rule shall not apply to hearings to consider subject matter when no legislation has been presented, nor shall the rule apply to resolutions which simply URGE action to be taken.

101308 [Health Code Amendment - Assisted Mental Health Pilot Project] Sponsor: Alioto-Pier

101310 [Public Works Code Amendments - Regulation of Freestanding Newsracks and Fixed Pedestal Newsracks]

Sponsor: Alioto-Pier

Ordinance amending the San Francisco Public Works Code by amending Sections 184.2, 184.6, 184.8, and 184.12 thereof, relating to newsracks, to provide for: (1) the use of electronic mail for notices of violations; (2) removal of abandoned newsracks or newsracks maintained in violation of the Public Works Code within 5 business days of notice of violation sent by electronic mail; (3) imposition of administrative fines for violations; (4) consolidation and/or reduction in size of fixed pedestal newsracks at under-used locations; (5) allocation of space in newsrack boxes on a first-come-first-served basis under certain circumstances; and (6) reduction of the fixed pedestal permit fee from \$60 to \$50.

Board procedures do not permit: 1) persons in the audience to vocally express support or opposition to statements by Supervisors or by other persons testifying; 2) ringing and use of cell phones, pagers, and similar sound-producing electronic devices; 3) bringing in or displaying signs in the meeting room; 4) standing in the meeting room.
