
SoMa Youth and Family Zone: Height Map



The Department of Public Health (DPH) respectfully requests approval of the attached 12B Sole Source waiver for the following:

### **Laboratory Corporation of America**

Purpose:

To renew the contract for lab services for Community Behavioral Health Services (CBHS) Section that includes providing testing supplies and specimen collection at CBHS clinical facilities, and having sufficient drop-in specimen collection and blood draw site locations throughout San Francisco such that clients have access to sites in, or near, their residential neighborhoods.

CBHS clinical lab services will include, but will not be limited to the following areas: chemistry, drug testing, hematology, serology, urinalysis and blood counts

associated with Cocaine (Coaxial).

Amount:

Utilization is estimated at \$190,160 for a two-year term.

**Fund Source:**

December 1, 2008 through November 30, 2010

Rationale for this 12B Sole Source Waiver request is that Laboratory Corporation of America (Lab Corp), who is currently providing clinical lab services for CBHS, is willing to continue providing such services to CBHS; making lab Corp the only such provider willing to do business with CBHS.

- RFP-3-2008 for clinical lab services was first published on March 4, 2008, and received no response.
   As there were no responses, the RFP was amended, simplified and reissued as RFP-3-2008
   Amended and Reissued.
- RFP-3-2008 Amended and Reissued was published on June 11, 2008, and, once again, received no response.
- Both solicitations were posted on OCA's contract opportunities website, advertised in the City's official newspaper, and outreach made to vendors known to have interest in such a contract.
- A new RFP for clinical lab services for CBHS will be solicited in 24 months.

This memo comes to request a waiver from Chapter 12B requirements for a firm named AVO Training Institute, the only proposer on Request for Proposals #SFMTA 2008-10 issued on October 24, 2008.

The SFMTA Overhead Lines Department was mandated by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to train MUNI operators on safe work practices to be used when handling the high voltage (catenary) overhead lines that power the street cars and trolleys.

In response to this mandate, the agency issued an RFP and solicited proposals from three companies, AVO Training Institute, American Trainco and National Technology Transfer. We received one proposal in response to the RFP from AVO Training Institute.

AVO has completed the 12B Declaration (copy attached) and indicated that they provide some benefits to common law spouses, but not same sex domestic partners. The Account Manager, Greg Rice, informed me by email that the company cannot comply. A copy of the email is attached.

The SFMTA Overhead Lines Department needs to contract with AVO to provide this training because of the State PUC audit finding that cited the agency for not meeting CAL/OSHA mandated training requirements.

To our knowledge, there are no potential contractors that comply with Chapter 12B requirements who are also able to meet the training requirements established by the State PUC. (Reference Cal. Admin Code, Title 8, Subchapter 5, Group 2 (High Voltage Electrical Safety Orders).

We therefore respectfully request a waiver from Chapter 12B requirements based on the facts described above.

This is in response to Supervisor Sean Elsbernd's October 23, 2008 inquiry requesting the feasibility of establishing a STOP sign at 16<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Wawona Street.

Based on our review we do not recommend STOP signs at this intersection. Although presently uncontrolled, the right-of-way at this T-intersection is clearly defined. Drivers approaching this intersection from southbound 16th Avenue must yield to through traffic on Wawona Street. Furthermore, a review of collision information indicates that this intersection has been operating safely, with no reported collisions over the last five years according to the San Francisco Police Department reports.



These ammenities, were not mentioned in the Memorandum of Understanding Between the city and CSU SFSU negotiations, and the lack of community input on possible mitigation or payment, rent-reduction or alternative open space provision was not discussed or even mentioned.







## **ARE THEY GODS?**

#### By Ugo Nardi

Many years ago the Vatican newspaper "Osservatore Romano" criticized an Italian movie star for demanding what it considered an outrageous amount of money to make a film. The newspaper asked rhetorically what was the comparative worth of the actress as a human being to value herself so highly, what was her contribution to humanity.

Today in America some chief executive officers are paid in one day as much as their employees are paid in one year.

Such huge difference in compensation elicits the question whether such officers are truly worth hundreds of times their employees, whether their contribution to humanity is so high above the charts to justify their compensation, their responsibilities greater than those of the president of the United States.





Today, November 18, 2008, I again prepared graphics to display with my public comment and again the graphics were not available in the broadcast record of the meeting on SFGTV or the video-on-demand record of the meeting available on the website archive.

This is getting more and more disturbing. It should not be necessary for me to outline the reasons why I prepare graphics. It should be sufficient to point out that I feel that the graphics provide both a counterpoint and an emphasis for my comments. What I have to say has a certain meaning that is different when the graphics cannot be seen.

I verified during my comment that graphics were running on the computer and were visible on the confirmation screen.

The media services department has been receptive to my questions and somewhat accommodating. My understanding was that a city-owned computer was implemented so that technical compatibility issues could be solved once and for all.

I have been told directly by Jack Chin of SFGTV, and I quote, "We do not cooperate with the public." It has now become clear that this is emphatically true. Now the question becomes whether this is acceptable.

Since I spoke today about Sunshine laws and open government during my comment, this is particularly apt. The whole idea of open meetings and broadcast of meetings is that public exposure of the process of government will make the government accessible and accountable to the people. You may have heard of the principles of "government of the people, by the people and for the people."

While I am at it, the intolerance that the Supervisors feels comfortable in displaying to speakers is also becoming alarming. I go to Library Commission meetings, so I am no stranger to tactics that show contempt for the public, but I would have expected the Supervisors to set a higher standard of democracy, as well as of responsibility.



Dear Ms. Calvillo,

Thank you for your letter which outlined the expectations of the members of the Board of Supervisors in the event of a large emergency. Specifically, your letter poses the question of how the Department of Emergency Management will incorporate the role and expectations of the members of the Board of Supervisors into the City's Emergency Operations Plan.

Your stated expectations include:

- Providing visible leadership;
- Having first-hand access to information via multiple modes of communication;
- Being prepared to fulfill their duties to review and, if appropriate, approve the declaration
  of emergency and actions taken to meet the emergency;
- Being able to convey to their constituents that an appropriate and effective response is being provided to maintain or restore public safety.

The President of the Board typically provides Board representation on the Mayor's advisory Policy Group comprised of key department heads, selected by the Mayor, who have roles in response and recovery as outlined in the Emergency Response Plan. A mandated role of the full Board during response to a large emergency is to review and approve, (if appropriate) emergency declarations and actions. The City charter states in part, "In meeting an emergency, the Mayor shall act only with the concurrence of the Board of Supervisors, or a majority of its members immediately available if the emergency causes any member of the Board to be absent. The Mayor shall seek the Board's concurrence as soon as is reasonably possible in both the declaration of an emergency and in the action taken to meet the emergency. Normal notice, posting and agenda requirements of the Board of Supervisors shall not be applicable to the Board's actions pursuant to these provisions;" therefore, at the onset of a large disaster, DEM would expect the Supervisors to make themselves available to convene at City Hall or other designated location, at the call of the President of the Board, to be briefed and provide concurrence as noted above.

We also understand and recognize the obligation of the Supervisors to assist the response by providing visible leadership and reassurance to their constituents. As we learned during the Cosco Busan oil spill, effective communication is the key to ensuring that all City officials, and primarily, Board members, have the required up-to-date information necessary to prepare them to participate in approving necessary declarations and actions. To that end, in addition to development of a full Joint Information Center, we have designated an Emergency Operations Center liaison position whose responsibility will be to interact with the Board members and their staffs on a regular basis using available communication vehicles including in-person briefings, telephone conference calls, emails, and text messaging. I have assigned policy and planning manager Amiee Albertson Alden as the primary staff member in that role (amiee.alden@sfgov.org; 415-558-3803). You and your staff should feel free to contact her at any time.

In addition, the ability of the Supervisors to interact with their constituents and, when possible, establish a presence in their districts, will be critical – especially in the immediate aftermath of an event. Experience shows that it typically take 48-72 hours for the government to shift from immediate disaster response by first responders addressing the site specific areas in critical distress, to more citywide support. Therefore, we look forward to working with you on a plan that is intended to describe how we can enable neighborhood level initiatives to solve problems, especially in this interim period when residents will be looking for local leadership. This role will be described in more detail as we complete our Emergency Response Plan and add the Community Annex. In addition, as we move from response to recovery, the Supervisors will each play a critical role in the process of rebuilding our City.

Finally, the Department of Emergency Management is in the process of developing training for the Board of Supervisors that is intended to give members more information on the City's Emergency Response plans as well as brief new members regarding expectations in potential emergencies, of any scope, that would prompt an emergency declaration. Our goal is to develop a short presentation that we could begin to personally deliver to each member beginning in late January 2009. We hope and expect that training to result in meaningful discussions with each Board member that will result in a better overall plan for the City.

I am forwarding this introductory letter to your office, to inform you, the MTA and the Commissioners that I am very interested in this post. And, within the City and County of San Francisco, I am probably the most qualified person you will find for the position. I have enclosed all the documents, which you will need to make a determination.

First, I am on the Human Resource Registry in five placements, with over 1000 points in each classification. These job classes are: Administrative Analyst 1822, Senior Administrative Analyst 1823, Principal Administrative Analyst 1824 and Chief Principal Analyst 1825. Over the past 18 months, I have filled out over a half a dozen 1823 & 1824 applications for posts at the MTA, which I did not obtain. Also, Human Resources at SFO, which takes in many ground transportation issues, rated my application with questions and answers at 1035 points for their 9255 Economic Planner post. I was informed that this position still on the table. It was the highest rating the SFO HR had obtained for the post. At this moment, I believe, the post is still open.

Second, I am the only taxi driver or "A" cardholder in San Francisco with an AA, BA and MBA. Plus almost 90 post MBA college semester units in office software, tax accounting and paralegal requirements. In the past four years, I have updated my resume with three 30-semester unit certificates, one being in micro computerized accounting, Microsoft's full Office Suite. Today, in light of present crude oil and diesel fuel prices, I feel, biodiesel and the diesel engine is the best option for the future. Rudolf Diesel invented the diesel engine for the poor dirt farmer. Farmers in the in the middle of nowhere, that could not afford petroleum products, but could squeeze cotton, olive, soybean or any other oil based plant seeds and put this vegetable oil-fuel in their tractor's Diesel fuel tank. The past 75 years of petroleum product marketing has abrogated this fact. I can show Muni and the county how to cut their fuel costs permanently. The diesel engine is designed to run on any kind of vegetable oil. It will run well on filtered used frying or cooking oil, which up to recently was given away for free or poured into city sewers. The oil industry does not want you to get your for nothing, but "yes, you can."

I know I have the ability to communicate effectively in writing and orally. I am an effective speaker and writer and have stood before the Board of Supervisors, Taxi Commission, the Municipal Transportation Agency and other Commissions, as well.

On behalf of the United Association of Plumbers, Pipefitters and Journeymen, Local 38, I write to ask that you approve the finance plan Hunter's Point Shipyard and Candlestick Point development plan scheduled for November 17, 2008 at the Land Use and Economic Development Committee. Our union will directly benefit from this project, which will provide good jobs at good wages to the working men and women we represent.

The economic crisis currently facing our country, state and city can only be eased by providing work for our members and the community at large. The once-thriving neighborhood where the project will be developed is long overdue for new investments in housing, infrastructure, parks and open space. We believe this project is vital to sustaining San Francisco's economy in challenging economic times and offers a great deal for working families we represent.

Board Chairman & Supervisors:

I have enclosed this brief based on the Full Board meeting which will take on these issues on November 25, 2008. The reason I am submitting these documents, is based on the present facts in this agency transition. It is my belief; this transaction is more like a "hijacking" and "collision" with the Municipal Transportation Agency MTA. The plan being put forth by the MTA is short on facts and substance. Essentially is it no plan at all. And, the problem lays with Debra Johnson the MTA's Chief of Staff and Nathaniel Ford, the Director. Ms Johnson comes to the task as the MTA ex-Human Resource Director. She has absolutely no skills in dealing with a group this diverse. As such, she refuses to meet with actual taxi drivers, and like the previous Taxi Director, Ms. Heidi Machen, has made denigrating statements about them. Ms. Machen in a news magazine stated, "They are ex-cons," For the Taxi Advisory Group TAG, she has picked one non medallion holding driver out of nine posts, and this driver has problems with the English language. And, I have never seen him speak at a Taxi Commission Hearing.

First, for the past fifty years, since the time that most of the present cab companies were formed in San Francisco, the lease paying taxi drivers in this City (ones that do not own a medallion). have been without unemployment insurance, medical and dental, days off with pay, grievance procedures and any sort of retirement pension, and have been subsidizing the City with their income. There are five to seven thousand (5000-7000) drivers in this class which Ms. Johnson and Nathaniel Ford want, again, to ignore. The reality, most do not make \$20,000 a year driving full time for the City. These drivers do not own cab companies, hotels, restaurants or have medallions, while they eke out a living that cannot support a household here. And, in these dire economic times, this shortage of income is becoming dearer. Yet, taxicabs Presidents, hotel and restaurant owners and Restaurant Association Members, Taxi Medallion Holders, comprise the majority of the MTA plan. You cannot have service if the driver cannot pay his rent, driving.

Second, the MTA is bankrupt and becoming more so under the Direction of Nathaniel Ford. And, the reason for it, is simple and plain. Mr. Ford has no academic background in finance or accounting. Neither does his Chief of Staff, which at present is his constant companion. And, Muni On-time-records have gone down for the last two years, and he has been here, for three. I do not know how this happened, but Mr. Ford is an ex-New York City Subway Driver, bus driver and truck driver. He has had no formal training in management, administration or finance when he was picked for the post in Atlanta. He then led Atlanta's Municipal Transportation System into the biggest bankruptcy in their history. And, was plucked from the job of administration of this post by Mayor Newsom. His college background, his one and only BA

degree would never be recognized by any accredited agency in the State of California, because one third of his courses, for which he got credit, had nothing to do with academics. He was given college credit for bus driving and stamping transit passes. When he left Atlanta, there were allegations of massive fraud against Mr. Ford, among them, there was the one charge where he was accused of running up a MasterCard bill of \$150,000 for himself and his secretary, before he left, during the time he knew he was leaving. These charges are tantamount to embezzlement under the law. After adding almost 22 million dollars to MTA's overhead, he is planning to use the same tactic for the Taxi Agency. This financial scam is not what the public voted on.

Last, I am a taxi driver that is on the medallion list for both the wheelchair access and regular sedan. I am trained to and have picked up the handicapped, and know what the real problems are here. I have been driving a taxi in San Francisco for twelve years. I am on five Administrative Analyst Human Resource Registry Lists and one for the 9255 Economic Planner in this City, and have been rated by the County and City of over 1000 points, in these six classes, and although I have applied for 16 posts at the MTA, over a period of two years, I have not received one letter of acknowledgement that I was qualified to sweep the floors. Ms. Johnson was the HR Director during this period. And, in this present economic climate, many drivers average \$50 a day.

In 2006, I applied for the Deputy Director Post at the SF Taxi Commission, which was an Administrative Analyst position, Class 1823, an accounting and audit position, but was blocked by Mayor Gavin Newsom when he picked his ex-campaign funds aide for the job. I have been applying for posts ever since, at this Agency and almost every agency in San Francisco, for which I have filled out over 176 applications to date. Since 2006, I have been batting "0".

At present, there is this opening at the MTA, as the *Director of the Taxi and Accessible Services Commission*, and as a spokesman for the taxi drivers which own nothing within this system, since July 3, 2008 when I gave my application to the MTA Commission; I have not heard one word from the MTA on it. They want to pick someone, again, that does not have my academic and taxi background in this very unique taxi transportation issue. As of this date, my complaints to the City Human Resource Department Head and the Civil Service Commission have gone nowhere. These agencies will get a copy of this request

So, at this time, it is my hope that the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco, vote on this matter in the best interests of the public that they serve. And, that they look at the issue of this new Accessible Services Appointment, as well.

# Ms. Callahan:

I am enclosing a letter that I received from Beverly Lee in Human Resources with reference to the Class 922 Manager post, where I filled out one of many post applications. And, I am sending you this letter because I have been filling out applications for posts at City Hall and other Departments in San Francisco County, since 2006. (I kept all the records since 2006, although these applications really go back to 2005) Although I started filling out these applications in the boom times, three to four years later I am still looking for a City Post. For the posts that I have been rated 1000 points or more, a number (1) by civil service procedures, I have been batting zero. The Human Resource Department in San Francisco has a built in "firewall" for "certain" Civil Service Registry List applicants. Although I have been rated with these number one category points in six classes on Civil Service Examinations for Administrative Analysts 1820, 1822, 1823, 1824, 1825 & 9255 Economic Planner for SFO, since 2006 I have had one job interview. And, according to the San Francisco Examiner, this job interview was in a city department where it was reported: Twenty percent of the employees are related to one another. To resolve the issue, the city hired a PhD from India or Pakistan to control it.

Also, I have enclosed Beverly Lee's letter because it is the type of post reply I have been getting (when I get a letter back) for the last three years. In my application for the post, I sent Ms. Lee 22 documents which included transcripts, ratings by City Departments, resumes, copies of letters to past employers, DD-214s for Veteran status and more. I sent her copies of all my tax courses. I sent her letters of requests from employers requesting more documents, Stuff that was supposed to be requested after the hire not for each and every application. As time rolls on, many of these firms are changing hands. And, then Ms. Lee put up this smoke screen about customer service programs and claimed, I did not provide any written verification of my experience. Ms. Lee must feel that customer service programs in San Francisco are reserved for the foreign born and are the equivalent to Astro Physics. This is the math it takes to land a rocket on Titan, 13 years from today. Maybe for the post she is looking for PhD from China or India that showed up on these shores, last month. Customer service programs can be learned, quickly, by men or women whose number one language is English. And, really, you do not need

someone with an AA, BA, MBA and 60 college semester units in Microsoft Office software, for the post. Customer Service is a people skill, so Ms. Lee can get someone that speaks Cantonese. As to what specific, exact, right on the money, working knowledge of all customer service programs in their entirety, that Ms. Lee wanted, well, who knows? Maybe it would take a couple of weeks to learn all of these programs. Or maybe, this City in its hunt for absolute complete diversity is not looking for US military veterans with Anglo surnames. Maybe, Ms. Lee, while working her "Firewall" is looking just for people that are Cantonese, Spanish, Paki/Indian or any other new American that needs a post. I know that this new "diversity" means it excludes me. The SFO Commission has gone on record, building a "firewall" under the banner of "diversity." I have absolutely nothing against the Chinese or other Asians, but every human resource person I have dealt with in this County, is only Chinese.

This year, San Francisco International Airport (SFO), which is owned by the City and County, was hit with a reverse-discrimination suit ruling. The City denied the allegation, but paid a million dollars to get rid of it, anyway. What the hell, Civil Service procedures are just that, made to be violated, manipulated, corrupted and massaged: And, due to this format, the Civil Service System in San Francisco may be rigged? For three years I have been getting letters from Human Resource representatives like the one from Ms. Lee, with last names like Chung, Woo, Fong, Wong, Lee and Ma. For these representatives, possibly, I could fill out applications until I dropped dead. If three years is not long enough, to do so, maybe five years of filling out applications would be better. I have lived in San Francisco for 35 years, so I have some knowledge of what is taking place, the new exclusion. I have been to City Hall long enough to know that many of their hires have problems with English, but passed Ms. Lee's qualification check with flying colors.

Over the last five years, while I have been looking for a City post and have been polishing my resume. In the interim, in a non-professional occupation, I have been driving a taxi for good funds. Weekly, I speak before the San Francisco Taxi or Municipal Transportation Commission (MTA), on the corruption in the city taxi business. San Francisco taxi firms, under each and every Mayor, skim more that the MTA loses each year. And, through these speaking engagements, I have become very well versed on the politics at City Hall.

Since 2006, I also have had a long running battle with the Mayor of this City. In 2006, Mayor Gavin Newsom did what many human resource departments do every day, "as a city official," he picked one of his close companions for a post at the San Francisco Taxi Commission. He did so, after I filled out three applications for this job. I was the most qualified to obtain it. The original SF Taxi Commission Deputy Director posting called for a Class 1823 Analyst, someone with a BA, MBA and someone with extensive office software capabilities. And, in a half page statement, it called for a person with extensive background in the taxi business. There is only one driver in San Francisco with this unique background. That is this applicant. But, weeks later, I watched the posting to change and morph into a call for a young attorney right out of law school, one that worked on Gavin Newsom's re-election Committee. So, I complained to the Civil Service Commission. But, I also filled out five more applications at this agency and never even

got a reply to any of them. This is due to the premise that the SF Taxi Commission is massaged and manipulated by Gavin Mayor Newsom. The agency has been an employment agency for his friends. This year, the agency is folding into the MTA.

At the MTA, over the past three years, I applied for 16 or 17 posts when Debra Johnson was its Human Resource Director. And, at the MTA three years later she is still drubbing me. Ms. Claudia Ma is their associate there. Early July, in a Commission Hearing, I applied for the new post, "Director, San Francisco Taxi & Accessible Services Commission. I am not into filing Civil Complaints, but maybe I should look into it. Because, since July, this agency has not even bothered to respond to the application or two others related to Class 1823 and 1824 Administrative Analysts. And, in July, I presented seven copies of this one Director Application with supporting documents before the MTA Commission. There are 7000 taxi drivers in this City that have no pensions, medical or dental insurance, and or unemployment benefits with grievance procedures.

But, the MTA does not want to hear this decent employment noise; they are losing millions of dollars already and are planning to hire someone else. The problem is, based on the San Francisco taxi business; there is absolutely no one in this City more qualified than I am for this post, as well. Having lived in San Francisco since 1970, with two daughters who were born here, raised here, and went to school here, I know most real transportation issues. I have worked in the financial district, lived the inner Sunset, the outer Mission and the Marina. I have used every Muni line in this City at one time. And, as a cab driver, I have worked and driven for nine firms, driven across 47 square miles and know they do not have a clue to what Generally Applied Accounting Principles (GAAP) are. So, these firms skim millions. Ms. Lee knows, I work part time as a California Tax Preparer. As such, I know most California & federal tax rules & laws.

And, I am still here applying for these posts.

Mr. Lasden:

I know that San Francisco for aspiring lawyers may be like heaven on earth. But, it seems that in this City many lawyers live a fantasy. A few weeks back, Heidi Machen's myopic view of the San Francisco taxi scene, as published in your great magazine, the California Lawyer was mailed to me by another graduate of UC Hastings College of the Law, my brother Alexander Lawrence. He is licensed attorney that has worked on Union and Human Resource Law. Days later, I read Ms. Machen's story in disbelief, and then one more time for that "shock and awe." Although the application of law in itself is an honorable profession, the many individuals that study it to become barristers, are not really interested in law at all. The facts are, today, many of these law school graduates are short on ethics and other values. Heidi Machen, in your In Pro Per section is one of these individuals. The ex-Mayor of San Francisco, Willie L. Brown, a Hastings alumna is another. And, this is not a reflection of the fine institution, which Hastings is; it is just that these graduates use the institution as a "license to steal." I am not going to waste much time writing about Willie Brown, but Heidi and Willie share the same values. They used their public service to feed their friends.

"I know Hastings is a great institution; I use its Law library to work on an ABA approved paralegal certificate. And, armed with a Community College card, I am narrowing in on Intellectual Property Law and extracting multiple cases related to 'unique copyright theft,' at this institution."

Ms. Heidi Machen may have been a graduate of Hastings, but it did not help her role as the Director of the San Francisco Taxi Commission. As Director she was a colossal disaster. Machen did not decide to leave her position as she states, because I am the one most responsible for having her dragged to the guillotine. I discovered she was afflicted with a Marie Antoinette syndrome. She had no idea how little a "lease-paying-taxi-driver made," yet she spent her time attempting force more rules and regulations on these cab drivers. During Machen's reign, she had no idea that most drivers do not make enough "bread" to pay their San Francisco rent. Almost all drivers have other incomes, or they fade away. First, they get kicked out of their apartments for not making enough to pay the rent. This is San Francisco, not downtown Bagdad. I have two other part time jobs. A major problem for Machen was, she could never see the forest or the trees, only the weeds and the dirt. At one point Heidi Machen became so paranoid, she spent tens of thousands in City funds to fortify her bank vault kingdom. Then, she pushed to expand

her kingdom's budget and hire more investigators to investigate lease-paying-taxidrivers. Yes, she investigated others, but not with much success or zeal. I observed Machen's behavior at Taxi Commission Hearings. She had my statements about her, the Commission and the Mayor, removed from the public record. She practiced this illegal censorship until I complained in front of the Commission. As Director of the SF Taxi Commission, Heidi specialized in the exclusion of lease-paying-taxi-drivers from any decision about their income. Ms. Machen actually strived to become the female version of Elliott Ness, within the San Francisco taxi industry. In the dark never land of the murky San Francisco taxi business, she enjoyed being quoted, talked about and linked to our flaming metrosexual mayor. She did not need a tattoo on her forehead; she had one on her rear. One of the most powerful forces on this earth: The Power of Denial possessed her. If Ms. Machen thought her story in the California Lawyer was the truth, she should see a doctor.

# "The Ex-SF Taxi Director's Fabrications, Lies & Felonious Appointments" By Emile Lawrence, August 2008

The above caption is my take on Ms. Heidi Machen as an elite bureacrat in San Francisco's corrupt every day politics. She works with many pretending to "do good." Sometime back, Vladimir Putin was quoted in a paper. He stated his biggest fear, with the transformation of the Soviet economy, was that one day he would be driving a taxi in Moscow. Due to many reasons, there are a lot of dispossessed Russians driving taxis in Moscow and in San Francisco, too. Mr. Gorbachev has an apartment in this town, and if chance played another role Putin could have one here, too. In her piece, Heidi called SF taxi drivers ex-cons. The late Tim Russert drove a cab, once. And, coalition forces in Iraq could not find Saddam Hussein for a while, because this leader drove an orange taxi. Charles Taylor, the ex-dictator of Liberia drove a taxi in Boston, before heading to Liberia. And, Bill Clinton was Senator Fulbright's limousine driver, at one time. These ex-cons are part of the absent big picture. And, Ms. Machen never had any guilt feelings about her salary, though, while at the Commission.

Ms. Machen made ~\$140,000 a year, as Director, while the majority of the 7000 licensed non medallion holding lease-paying-drivers in her kingdom made, maybe, \$17,000. Many drivers are too humble to admit what they really make, so they lie and tell their friends they make much more. As one of her routine chores, Heidi Machen helped promote the fraudulent lease-paying-taxi-driver income story. She allowed fabrications and untruths about taxi driver income into the public record. These stories were promoted by the equipment leasing companies, the taxi firms that paid no unemployment, medical, dental or pension money for their workers, which are always certified as independent contractors. And, most large and small cab firms skim more money from the industry than the Municipal Transportation Agency (MTA) in San Francisco, loses each year. As the Commission added hundreds of extra cabs to the streets, listening to squeaks and hollers from the hotel and restaurant industry, lease-paying-cab-driver income plunged to lows not seen since the Great Depression. And, with more taxi medallions on the street, the bread and butter of cab companies, firm income exploded. This happened under

Machen's reign. She never had any idea what a lease-paying-cab-driver went through on any given day, to make a living. The blue collar job has lines of drivers willing to work only for a fist-full of dollars, and the turnover of drivers on an annual basis in this town is greater than any other industry in America. The driver with the bullhorn at Heidi's window, one night, was not crazy when I knew him. Ms. Machen with her "holier than thou" policies drove him crazy. Under Draconian rules and regulations, fines and citations for doing one's job, the Kaufman dude just flipped out. But, other drivers have done the same thing and never made the papers. Some committed suicide. I have run into ex-drivers begging on these City streets. Under Machen, taxi driver conditions became pretty pathetic.

In 2006, Heidi Machen was terminated as the Director of the San Francisco Taxi Commission, for what appeared to be fraud. The information on this fact was left out of her story. She helped prepare and approve fraudulent employment documents for her housemate, house partner, bed partner or client of record. With Mayor Gavin Newsom's help or OK, she trashed the City's Civil Service System. She tossed five applications of mine without as much as a letter. Mr. Gavin Newsom learned how to work this Civil Service System from his mentor; Willie L. Brown. And, Ms. Machen's house partner was the ex-con she talked about in her tale. She lived with the ex-con and was his attorney of record for 16 years. The San Francisco Taxi Commissioners found out about it and canned her during a closed-door session. Then, Mayor Gavin Newsom the Governor-to-be stepped in. He re-instated Machen and terminated the Commissioners which fired her. At the time, the SF Mayor made a public statement: The crime was just a one-time event. The official spin being that Heidi's housemate was one honest dude. Heidi Machen's live-in felon was a cab driver at one time. And, please sit down for this statement. He used to take fares to SFO, San Francisco International Airport and go back to their house and empty it. Ms. Machen made the bandit, the Director of Finance for the San Francisco Taxi Commission. This Finance Director's 16-year crime wave also consisted of bouncing checks across America for computer equipment he ordered. I have the sixty-page file for anyone that needs a copy of Heidi and a man that went by an assortment of names. I think Alan Cohen was one of them. According to one source, Ms. Machen also hired her ex-con playmate as an auditor at the SF Water Department when she worked there. What the hell, Daniel Steel married an ex-con. The very honorable SF Mayor Newsom had no problem with the issue when he re-instated Ms. Machen. When another SF Supervisor accused Mayor Newsom of being on drugs, to me, it made sense. This Mayor is big on hair gel and Hollywood style make-up. At times, he may have sniffed some of it. So, in order to get our Mayor to roll Heidi's head into the horse cart, I supplied the Mayor's Office, the District Attorney, the City Attorney and the twelve members Board of Supervisors their own copies of a dossier of crimes on this Director's man, at my expense.

When Ms. Machen got her job back, the felonious housemate resigned. Ms. Machen hired him as Deputy Director at ~\$80,000 a year, but now there was an opening. In order to apply for this post, as stated in the posting, one had to be on the Human Resource Registry. I am on it in five different classes, such as Administrative Financial Analysts 1820, 1822, 1823, 1824 & 1825. I am the only taxi driver in San Francisco with an MBA,

advanced certificates in Microsoft Office Suite and ten years on the streets. As a matter of fact, for two years I have been at the top of these five classes with a rating of 1000 pts. Not that this rating has done me any good. Just to get on this list, one needed an MA in business, accounting or some other related financial expertise. I was a securities and derivatives broker for fifteen years. For this Taxi Commission posting one also needed extensive taxi background. I filled out three applications for the post. And, as of this date, I have filled out over 160 City applications for posts and have had two interviews for my efforts. One was in a Department where 20 % of the workers are related to one another. And, I go on record stating, again, the Mayor of San Francisco has interfered in the civil service process, with respect to my applications, in more than one occasion. I may have to request an FBI or Department of Justice probe due to what he has done.

For this new Deputy Director position one application went to the Mayor, another to Machen and a third to the Taxi Commission. The taxi post and Class 1823 Senior Administrative Analyst opened and closed five times in two and a half months. Twice, it was open and not listed as being opened. But, one night in October of that year at a SF Taxi Commission Hearing we had this announcement by Machen; she had picked a new assistant to the Commission. This person is now the present Director Ms. Jordanna Thigpen, an attorney that worked on the Mayor's re-election Campaign Fund. But, the official post did not call for an attorney. I complained to the Civil Service Commission, but they told me everything was fair and above board. Later, I was shown a new copy of the posting, one which was never posted, one that called for an attorney without any taxi background at all. Many feel the San Francisco Civil Service System is rigged, and it sure looks like it. Heidi just followed what Gavin did and he learned to manipulate this job system from his mentor, Willie. When Willie was asked by a phone caller during his radio show, "Why aren't you in jail, yet?" He replied by saying, "I can only be accused of feeding my friends at the county trough." According to the investigative journalists, Mayor Willie Brown may have hired up to ~700 or more assistant Mayors with the statement, "you white guys have been doing this for 150 years, so why are you looking at me?"

Late this year, if everything goes according to schedule, the SF Taxi Commission is going to be merged into the Municipal Transportation Agency (MTA) and I have spoken about the policy of lease-paying-taxi-driver exclusion at both agencies. But, it looks like this driver exclusion will continue. Debra Johnson, the chief of Staff for MTA, recently put together a passive Taxi Advisory Group known at TAG, to help the merger of the Taxi Commission within the MTA. And, like every Director at the Taxi Commission, Ms. Johnson followed the same venue and excluded lease-paying-taxi-drivers from their own affairs, again. There is one lease-paying-taxi-driver in a group of nine posts. Her group is weighed down with hotel workers, cab firm owners, restaurant impresarios and medallion holders, individuals with a history of squeezing the lease-paying-taxi-driver of income and benefits. People that treat the lease-paying-taxi-driver as if he is an ex-con. San Francisco Mayors have always liked it that way. Recently, Senator Feinstein, an ex-San Francisco Mayor has stated she might run for governor. I cannot wait. There have been rumors floating in this City since the bankruptcy of Yellow Cab in 1978, when Di-Fi was Mayor that she lifted 9 cab medallions for herself and they are hidden under a

layer of names. The corruption within the cab system is due to the taxi medallion system of pre and post K medallions. The pre-K medallion holder does not drive and the post K holder does drive. By my estimates, pre K medallion holders get about \$2400 a month, per medallion which they own. I sent U. S. Senator Feinstein a letter about this medallion rumor four years ago, but she did not respond. So, here is to "waiting for her to run." And, as for Heidi deciding to leave the agency, she left this fact out of her story. Mayor Newsom asked for all the Department Head's Resignation letters, when he got re-elected: To clean house, the Mayor accepted the letter by Director Heidi Machen.

Ms. Machen manipulated the civil service system with her post without remorse or punishment. The only thing I have against Jordanna Thigpen her successor is this: She bumped me for a post the civil service system showed I was the most qualified to obtain. And, in the process; she became tainted like foul or rotten meat. The City Attorney should have prosecuted Ms. Machen for the incident, but he is a Mayor Newsom lap dog. The City Attorney is gutless, spineless and is as foul and despicable as they come.

In a weekly newspaper story, Ms. Machen claimed: The Mayor allowed her to hire her friends. But, Ms. Machen's house partner never graduated from college and had no professional financial background or credentials, when she hired him as an auditor. Then, Machen hired Ms. Jordanna Thigpen for this vacated audit post, after being fired and rehired. I have filled out five applications at the SF Taxi Commission and fifteen or more at the MTA for Administrative Analysts positions. And, another application for the new post at the MTA related to the Taxi Commission Directorship once the merger is complete. Officially, I am still waiting for some "word." Machen left a transportation structure, where the taxi firms with corporate and other medallions still dictate fees, make the rules and milk the system for millions. As an effective spokesman for this de factolease paying-taxi-driver group, on Taxi and MTA closed circuit SFTV, I am now recognized by County citizens from time to time for my vigorous orations at these hearings. One fare recently told me, "you are too articulate to be a driver; you should run for something, a guy like you needs to be in charge. We need someone like you to run these charlatans out of town." Maybe this man is right.

Through a policy of total exclusion, lease-paying-taxi-drivers in San Francisco have no real wages or benefits. They will never ever be able to buy a home here. And, these San Francisco taxi drivers are still the "beasts of burden," with no voice in their own affairs, as they subsidize City hotels, restaurants and the MTA. This is Ms. Machen's legacy and the real taxi story, here.

Director Ford:

There are a number of reasons for why I have decided to send you a direct and personal letter.

One reason is this: We are on the opposite side of the fence. And, at the moment, I have nothing to lose. The Mayor has blocked me from more posts in this City, than any man alive. And, I have a lot less to lose than you. I am paid nothing for my mission and the Mayor cannot terminate me. So, with this voice for justice and equity, I come to you. At present, I am looking at the Municipal Transportation Agency (MTA) and you are sitting there. But, also, I am looking at a post at the MTA which is engulfed in politics. A post where the Mayor is standing over your should and there is no one more qualified than this candidate, for it. So, maybe we should have a private meeting.

It is known, I know more about the taxi business in this City than any person you will ever meet. And, with this information, I can actually help you, bring home the butter. I know Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP), investigative or forensic auditing, and investigative journalism. With my MA in financial ratios, I have an extensive background in corporate finance. It took me 12 months to put together a dossier on Heidi Machen. And, then it took another 12 months for her head to roll into a cart.

Under these present taxi rules and economic conditions, most taxi drivers in this City have a tough time paying their rent. While the cab firms steal the ham. The "medallion holders are a cartel" that squeezes the firms. Then, the cab firms squeeze us. That is the system. I will show you where the money is. I will fill you in on the taxi-cash-con-game.

Under the Sunshine Laws, by speaking before the various Commissions such as the Police, Ethics, Civil Service, SFO and MTA, I have learned about politics at City Hall. Two years ago, I started attacking the Mayor and the previous Taxi Commission Director, when Newsom bumped me from the Deputy Director post, when I was the most qualified for it, and installed Jordanna Thigpen, one of his liaisons. The Civil Service Commission investigated the event for me. Since then, Mayor Gavin Newsom has not been able to shut me up. And, at the MTA, I am going to be speaking until next year, as his political career comes to a close. Many Muni drivers on the buses now recognize me. So do many reporters.

So, if you would like to carry this discussion further, let me know. We can keep it private and official. No e-mails or phone calls, except by your aides. I believe, under your leadership, we can help the MTA fill a financial hole. I will show you the system.

Last, in the mid 1980s, while working at Dean Witter/Morgan Stanley, I attempted to get Muni to hedge crude oil for diesel fuel. Back then, after many discussions, we never got to first base. No one at Muni had a clue or foresight to determine what crude oil hedges could do for them. In the 1980s, oil was \$12 to \$18 a barrel and Diesel fuel was around .90 cents a gallon. Today, the new deal is bio-diesel and we could discuss this too. This City you could produce its own fuel at less than a dollar a gallon.

When DPT came out they called me to come down stairs to verify that the cars parked in the white zone were the same cars I called about (even though I had given them the make, license number and color of each vehicle). Of course, me coming downstairs at the request of DPT put a face to the person that has been trying to get DPT to enforce the laws of the white zone and it started a confrontation between me and the hotel staff. I am holding DPT responsible if any vandalism that might be done to my car as the result of DPT letting the hotel staff know who was complaining. The hotel staff knows me and what I drive. What ever happened to the privacy of the person calling in about the law being broken.

The hotel thinks they own the white zone because of the annual fee they pay and the application they submitted to DPT the hotel staff even stated it to the officer and that the parked cars in the white zone were cars of hotel guests, all cars in the white zone had a valet parking tag laying on the dash.

Around 8:00 p.m. I went to the gym and the white zone was again full of cars, I called DPT who said they would again send someone out, I let them know I would not be at home, that I was going out. I have no idea if they cam out or not. When I returned an hour later the white zone was still full of cars, I tried getting through to DPT but I was on hold for over 20 minutes and decided I had again had enough.

Here is the law on white zones from the DPT website.

White Zones



White zones are for passenger loading and unloading with a time limit of 5 minutes. The effective time of white zones vary and are indicated by signs or by stencils on the curb. (the curb in front of my building has not time indication) The drive must remain with the vehicle at all times (limited exceptions apply at preschools and hospitals.) (every time I have called DPT, the cars are parked, no one is in them or around them except for maybe the valet standing on the sidewalk)

White zones are NOT intended for private parking. Such zones are intended for establishments that have active passenger loading and unloading needs.

And none of this is dealing with the Valet Parking Permit the Hotel has and the way they park most of the valet cars in public parking spaces on the street. I have a great picture on my phone showing how they start early in the evening taking parking spaces along the street to be used for their valet parking. All it would take is some foot work and someone actually watching the business to stop all of this from taking place. I see it, and its not like I stand around outside the apartment building all day.

This is becoming very frustrating.

## Dear LUEDC:

My husband and I are of one of the parties that are represented by Heidi Timken and Leslie Johnson, and we are very aware of the negotiations since last August. We give thanks to MOH for being willing to negotiate since you instructed them to do so that more owners would come back today happier owners.

Unfortunately, this is not the case. Today there are more owners that are Uphappier. Owners have shown great willingness to come agreement on a fair buyout agreement. Much progress had been shown until MOH's last proposal response. Not only are their buy out figures too much, MOH's current proposal re low income owners would have then buy out up to the tune of \$500K—we submit to you, this is not in the spirit of affordable housing.

Look closely at this proposal. It is way too much for owners to pay, and there is no basis to justify this. Prior to this proposal MOH was in discussion re a buy out figure that would settle the matter---and seemed open to this. MOH's current proposal is surprising—and will create tremendous hardship to low and moderate income housing owners who have shown great willingness to come to a fair agreement. While we understand the idea of replacement, it is Not the point -- because this rationale is based on the idea that the City owns our homes—and they do not. The City does not own our homes and never has. They have never put one dime into maintenance or improvement.

Please instruct MOH to go back to the negotiations table for another important round. We, as bmr owners know that affordable housing is the holy grail in SF. And we are totally behind the goal of affordable housing. But we have been part of a program that has been flawed for over 30 years. Like Barack Obama, we believe in a future of productive change. The Condo Conversion Program has been broken for so many years. It is time to change this. An infusion of funds from a fair buyout from current owners would fuel a productive change toward the goals of affordable housing in SF. It would provide ample funding for low and moderate income families to obtain loans to buy homes in SF AND finally make it right for owners who have been bearing the brunt for the program's historical ineffectiveness.

Please request that MOH go back to the negotiations table for a last round and finally do what is fair and right. The buy out numbers need to be reasonable given the low/moderate status of the owners, and their expectations at the time of purchase. It they are not, the City will be sued --and they will lose. The proposed ordinance will be invalidated, and owners will recover damages.

Expect print and tv media to bring public many years of the City's ineffectiveness. If the City is unwilling to come to an agreement with current owners, expect SF to become very

# RE: VOTE NO ON 080520 URGE MOH AND THE CITY ATTORNEY TO SETTLE WITH CURRENT LMI CCP OWNERS TO AVOID LITIGATION

# Dear LUEDC:

I was a renter at the Goldmine Hill Complex when the conversion from apartments to moderate income condominiums was approved by the City back in the 80's. Our GMH complex at that time had a Redevelopment Agency (RA) recordation against it and was in the past considered undesirable land. RA for decades had a 20-year resale restriction on low and moderate designated properties and more than 500 Low and Moderate Income (LMI) units were released from the resale restrictions long before the 20 year term limit expired. Although some buyers of LMI conversion units were allowed to make an in-lieu fee to the City and then were released from the LMI program, I was not given this same offer. Had such offer been extended to me, I would have gladly agreed to pay a 10% in-lieu fee at the time of my purchase.

I believe the 10% in-lieu fee should be offered today to resolve the current crisis of mismanagement and the City's failure to properly disclose such in-perpetuity restrictions. This offer should only be allowed if the owners maintain and or personally live in the LMI unit for 20 years or more and this is the most fair and equitable solution to the mess that this program is in. The LUED has recommended that MOH and the City Attorney come up with a fair solution and more recently, we were shocked to see that MOH and the City Attorney's proposal demands exorbitantly high fees that I pay the City approximately 2 times of what my unit cost me in 1986 to seek release from the program. Had in-perpetuity resale restriction and limitations of inheritance rights been to me at the time of my purchase. I would have NEVER purchased my rental unit. I was also not given the option to remain as a renter in my unit and either had to buy or be forced to leave my unit and be displaced. This was never the intent of the program and my rights as a renter and subsequent owner continue to be violated by the City. The City was conspicuously absent at the time of my purchase leaving the subdivider as their agent to disclose any known restrictions. The representations made to me at the time of my purchase by the subdivider/sellers and City literature gave no indication that I would be compelled to remain in the program in perpetuity. In fact, marketing materials disseminated by the City for decades conveyed that there were term limits for LMI properties. Also, my loan documents indicated that the City had only 2 years to buy back my unit.

The hard facts and realty by MOH's own admissions are that for decades the City has mismanaged and failures to properly monitor, oversee and failed to disclose our property rights. Contributing to the loss of more than 500 LMI CCP units to be released without paying a cent back into the program. The focus and responsibility and burden to make the program viable has now been placed squarely on the backs of those of us who had nothing to do with the oversight and management. This is not fair and this is no way to

treat long time San Francisco residents who have been law abiding tax payers. The City must be responsible for their mismanagement and not take it out on myself and others in the LMI CCP.

Our City needs to maintain affordable housing and I support changes and improvements to the LMI CCP but not as is proposed in Ordinance 080520 which will in effect rob Peter (LMI owners) to pay Paul (The City). The fact that the City allowed more than 500 units to be released from the program without getting any funds from these sellers to keep supporting the LMI program is not my fault and so I should not be responsible to bear the burden now, as MOH would like you to believe, to replace dollar for dollar another LMI unit in exchange for allowing my unit to be released. I am willing to make a huge increase in my offer to seek release by paying 10 times the amount that I should be allowed to pay had I been allowed to pay a 10% in-lieu fee.

Perhaps if the City is not willing to such reasonable offers being made by myself and many others in the program, and the City continues to reject an infusion of a potential funds that total in excess of over \$30 Million dollars from the 500+ unit owners in the LMI CCP, as well as tens of millions of dollars of additional property tax sales of such units, then you force myself and others to litigate against the City. Such litigation may likely result in the City having to not only release all of our units, but also may require that we be paid for damages and legal costs. It is not sound thinking to not accept my generous offer as the reality is you will NEVER have the right to my unit anyway as I plan to leave it to my heirs and not to the City for LMI use. After all, my property is in my name, and I have exclusively paid for all taxes and upkeep without a dime of City subsidies. It is my property and the City can't keep changing the rules of my property rights after the fact.

MOH's buy out proposal declares 50% of our profit of our unit yet no offer is being made by the City to contribute 50% of the financial burden to maintain the property. One would only wish the real estate and stock market had such 50% on ZERO investment as I'm sure all would be lining up around the globe to get such return on zero investment dollars. I would have NEVER purchased my unit had I been told that the City would make such an outrages claim against my property. I and hundreds of others in the program have been deceived and duped by the city that we were homeowners and this program is a SCAM and in reality we are nothing but glorified grounds keepers for the City while paying for our property taxes and improvements to maintain our property which the City is attempting to rob me of. This is a blatant violation of my rights as there were no policies and procedures in place for the LMI CCP until many years after I purchased my unit and it is illegal to retroactively change such terms of the purchase agreement without my approval. The facts are the City failed to properly and clearly disclose that there were inperpetuity resale restrictions against my property. Ordinance 080520 continues to strip away my property rights and I refuse to sign on to such legislation.

I urge you to **VOTE NO ON 080520** and not support this ordinance until and unless MOH and the City Attorney accept our generous offer to contribute to the city my settlement offer as well as the settlement offers made by many others in the program. I

respectfully urge you to insist that ALL such settlement funds collected by the City shall only be used towards building LMI housing, not to be used for administrative fees "General Funds" by MOH & the City.

It's time for a CHANGE and we need the City and the LMI program and an infusion of funds to build affordable LMI housing and that changes are made that fully disclose resale restrictions at the time of purchase. The new administration at MOH has done a lot in the past year to provide full disclosure and educate new first time buyers. However, they have yet to come to a fair and equitable resolution with those of us who are long time owners who did not receive such full disclosure at the time of purchase.

Alternatively, should the City not accept my buyout-offer, I am prepared, along with many others in the LMI CCP, to litigate against the City.

Let's merge BART and Caltrain into a single 5-county San Francisco Bay Rail District; call it Bay Rail, or BRAIL for short. \*Capitol Corridor: consider a tunnel to by-pass the Benicia drawbridge;

\*Consider a BART tunnel between SFO and OAK;

\*Consider a BART West Oakland by-pass with an intermodal at Magnolia;

\*Consider San Ramon Valley BART via I-680 and the former SP BO line;

\*Run BART to Santa Clara at grade along Caltrain instead of under Stockton Avenue.

- 5. Comments to the Plan. Dept. EIR scoping meeting of Nov. 6, 08 reiterated.

The use of the redevelopment process is necessary for an effective implementation of the Housing Element. As an added policy, I also suggest the redevelopment process be made, uniquely, as a trustworthy agency that would conform to state law in full protection of the equitable rights of our citizens and the safeguarding of the city's social and economic interests. As oversight, I suggest the creation of an urban development "ombudsperson."

The legal and professional definition of "policy" is "an administrative directive that is intended to be enforced." Policy proposals that do not include an implementation means are not policies. Such means must include legal and codified basis, resources and institutional aegis. Anything less is a wish without procreation.

Subject KEEP Middle Income Housing in the Mission District

TO: President Olague, Supervisor Maxwell, Supervisor Peskin,

I do NOT support removing the middle income housing alternative in the Mission, and urge you to keep the middle income alternative.

#### ECONOMIC FEASIBILITY:

The middle income housing strategy that the City has created relies on the Seifel Study -- an economic feasibility study that offers a practical approach that balances desired outcomes with what builders can reasonably build, and that was before the economic recession. MAC's legislation is NOT based on any study and represents an irresponsible and end run at this late date.

#### **NEIGHBORHOOD DIVERSITY:**

The Mission's economic and cultural diversity will suffer as middle income residents have fewer housing alternatives, and the Mission, which is already heavily low-income, will ghetto-ize low income residents.

#### MIDDLE INCOME LEFT-OUT

With SF's median housing prices at around \$800K, the City's inclusionary (affordable housing) program produces subsidized units priced, on average between \$180,000 for a studio to \$237,000 for a two bedroom. Unfotunately, a large proportion of our City, its middle class, earns too much money to qualify for subsidized housing, but cannot afford market-rate housing. Leaving out the middle-income class will make San Francisco a city of only poor and rich, removing a valuable swatch of families from the mix.

The middle income housing program proposed by the Planning Department could create housing priced at \$320,000 for a 1-bedroom home and \$370,000 for a 2-bedroom home. There is almost no housing being built in San Francisco at these prices.

Middle income housing is housing for working San Francisco families. 135% of San Francisco Median Income, the target range, describes a family of three, two working parents and a child, with each worker earning around \$50,000 a year. That income band includes a big part of the City, such as nurses and teachers, construction workers and executive assistants, all the types of folks at risk of not being able to live here.

Much of our most vital workforce is increasingly being forced to live far from San Francisco



because of the high cost of housing. We are currently doing virtually nothing to assure that middle-income families can afford to live in San Francisco. This is a policy failure we cannot afford to continue.

# CONCLUSION

I urge you to NOT support removing middle income housing alternative in the Mission.
