[Requiring the Mayor to submit a preliminary budget to the Board of Supervisors by the first working day of April, 2002, and requiring the Board to establish new deadlines for the submission of future budgets.]

Ordinance amending Administrative Code Section 3.3 to (1) require the Mayor to submit a preliminary budget to the Board of Supervisors by the first working day of April 2002 for the 2002-2003 fiscal year; (2) require that the existing timetable for submission of the budget expire on December 31, 2002, and (3) state the intention of the Board of Supervisors to approve a new timetable for subsequent fiscal years by not later than September 30, 2002.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by amending Section 3.3 to read as follows:

SEC. 3.3. BUDGET TIMETABLE.

- (a) Each elected and appointing officer, agency, board or commission, shall, not later than the twenty-first day of February of each year, file with the Controller, for check as to form and completeness, copies of his, her or its budget estimate approved in accordance with the provisions of the Charter.
- (b) The Controller shall, not later than the first working day of March of each year, consolidate such budget estimates and transmit the same to the Mayor, together with such other material as is required.
- (c) The Mayor shall, not later than the first working day of April, 2002, transmit to the Board of Supervisors a preliminary budget for the next fiscal year.

- (ed) The Mayor shall, not later than the first working day of June of each year, transmit to the Board of Supervisors consolidated budget estimates, proposed budget, detailed estimate of revenues, and estimates of amounts required to meet bond interest and fixed charges, together with his or her budget message and a draft of the annual appropriation ordinance, prepared by the Controller.
- the estimated revenues and assumptions contained in the Mayor's submission of the budget and provide an opinion regarding the accuracy and reasonableness of the economic assumptions and revenue estimates on or before the fifth working day following submission of the Mayor's budget to the Board. In addition, the Controller may also recommend to the Board such reserves as he or she considers prudent given the proposed resources and expenditures contained in the Mayor's budget.
- (ef) The Committee of the Board of Supervisors then having jurisdiction over the budget according to the Rules of the Board shall review the budget and recommend an Interim Appropriation and Salary Ordinance which shall reflect the budget transmitted by the Mayor; provided, however, that any funds for equipment, capital improvements, new positions of employment, or any other proposed expenditures may be placed in reserve until released by the Board of Supervisors; and provided, further, that said ordinances shall reflect the rates of compensation established pursuant to Charter Sections A8.403, A8.404, A8.409 and A8.590-1 through A8.590-5.
- (fg) The Board of Supervisors shall not later than the thirtieth day of June, finally pass the interim appropriation and salary ordinances.
- $(\underline{\mathfrak{gh}})$ The Board of Supervisors shall not later than the last working day of July, adopt the budget as proposed by the Mayor, or as amended by the Board of Supervisors.

Not later than the last working day of September, the Board of (hi)Supervisors shall adopt by ordinance the tax rate for the City and County including amounts required for debt service.

If any date shown falls on a nonbusiness day, the due date shall be the next succeeding business day.

The deadlines in this Section governing the budget timetable shall expire and be of no further effect as of December 31, 2002. It is the Board of Supervisors' intention to adopt a new timetable for submission of budgets in subsequent fiscal years not later than September 30, 2002. In order to meet this requirement for adoption of new legislation, the Clerk of the Board shall remind the Board in a timely fashion of the need to adopt the legislation, and calendar a hearing on the new legislation at the appropriate time.
