2 COMMENDING THE OCEAN AVENUE RENAISSANCE COMMITTEE FOR THEIR
3 DEDICATION AND COMMITMENT TO THE OCEAN AVENUE COMMUNITY IN THEIR
4 PROPOSAL FOR THE OCEAN AVENUE REVITALIZATION PROJECT AND URGING THE
5 MAYOR'S OFFICE, THE MUNICIPAL RAILWAY, THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC
6 WORKS, THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKING AND TRAFFIC, THE BUREAU OF LIGHT,
7 HEAT, AND POWER, AND THE WATER DEPARTMENT TO COMPLETE WORK ON THE
8 OCEAN AVENUE CORRIDOR RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT AND IMPROVEMENTS BY JULY
9 2002.

10 WHEREAS, Over the past few years, members of the Ocean Avenue
11 community came together to form the Ocean Avenue Renaissance
12 Committee; and,

13 WHEREAS, In August, 1999, the Ocean Avenue Renaissance Committee
14 presented the Mayor's Office and various City department
15 representatives with a vision for improving the streetscape and
16 quality of life along the Ocean Avenue Neighborhood Commercial
17 Corridor; and,

18 WHEREAS, The primary objective of the Ocean Avenue Renaissance
19 Committee was to expand the MUNI K-Line Rail Replacement project to
20 include more extensive improvements along Ocean Avenue; and,

21 WHEREAS, Following that presentation, the Department of Public
22 Works began developing an urban design concept plan that is now
23 reaching its final stages of completion; and,

1 WHEREAS, The urban design concept plan includes elements such as
2 bulb-outs, ornamental streetlighting, and landscaping for Ocean
3 Avenue and the Phelan Loop; and,

4 WHEREAS, In an exemplary effort of interdepartmental
5 cooperation, various City agencies involved in the K-Line project,
6 have signed a memorandum of understanding outlining their commitment
7 to the Ocean Avenue revitalization project; and,

8 WHEREAS, The Departments expect to complete final design of the
9 project by March 2000, to begin construction in July 2000, and to
10 complete construction by July 2002; now therefore be it,

11 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County
12 of San Francisco commends the Ocean Avenue Renaissance Committee for
13 their dedication and commitment to the Ocean Avenue community in
14 their proposal for the Ocean Avenue Revitalization Project; and be
15 it,

16 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and
17 County of San Francisco urges the Mayor's Office, the Municipal
18 Railway, the Department of Public Works, the Department of Parking
19 and Traffic, the Bureau of Light, Heat, and Power, and the Water
20 Department to complete work on the Ocean Avenue Corridor
21 Reconstruction Project and Improvements by July 2002.


