WHEREAS, The primary objective of the Ocean Avenue Renaissance Committee was to expand the MUNI K-Line Rail Replacement project to include more extensive improvements along Ocean Avenue; and,

WHEREAS, Following that presentation, the Department of Public Works began developing an urban design concept plan that is now reaching its final stages of completion; and,

WHEREAS, The Departments expect to complete final design of the project by March 2000, to begin construction in July 2000, and to complete construction by July 2002; now therefore be it,
