10 States will meet in Washington D.C. on Mother's Day, May 14, 2000, for the Million Mom
11 March; and,

12 WHEREAS, Rallies will also be held in Atlanta, Los Angeles, Portland, Tulsa, and
13 Austin as part of the Million Mom March; and,

14 WHEREAS, The Million Mom March is dedicated to the mission of educating our
15 children and our country about the life-threatening danger of guns; and,

16 WHEREAS, The purpose of the Million Mom March is also to petition Congress to
17 enact tougher gun control legislation requiring licensing and background checks of gun
18 owners, national registration of handguns, minimum safety standards for guns, and safety
19 locks and childproof technology for guns by Mother's Day 2000; now, therefore, be it

20 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
21 supports the efforts of the Million Mom March to petition Congress to enact meaningful gun
