Resolution urging several City departments to form a Task Force to assess transportation improvements in the Embarcadero area and to assess the impact of planned development projects on traffic and transportation in that area.

Resolution urging representatives of the Department of Parking and Traffic, the Transportation Authority, the Municipal Transportation Authority, the Department of Public Works, the Port of San Francisco, the Municipal Railway, the Fire Department and the Police Department in consultation with members of the public to form a Task Force to monitor existing and planned transportation improvements in the area and to asses the impacts of planned projects on traffic, parking, public transportation, and additional forms of transportation such as bicycles and pedestrians in the Embarcadero area.

WHEREAS, The demolition of the Embarcadero Freeway resulting from the Loma Prieta earthquake of 1989 has significantly changed transportation flow along the Northern Waterfront and transportation options offered in this area; and

WHEREAS, the Embarcadero Roadway Project was initiated after the earthquake to build The Embarcadero roadway in place of the freeway and to improve traffic flow and transportation offered in the Embarcadero area;

WHEREAS, the multiphase Embarcadero Roadway Project is currently being implemented, along with other modifications being made to the traffic and transportation infrastructure of the area; and

WHEREAS, the Port of San Francisco ("the Port") and the City and County of San Francisco ("the City") are exploring several development opportunities along the Embarcadero —including reuse of Piers 27, 29, and 31, and implementing certain projects that will significantly impact traffic, parking and other methods of transportation in the area, and;

RESOLVED, That Board of Supervisors calls for a creation of a Task Force to monitor transportation improvements in the Embarcadero area and to assess the impact of

Embarcadero area development projects on traffic, parking, public transportation, and additional forms of transportation such as bicycles and pedestrians; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, the objective of this Task Force will be to develop a long term, coordinated traffic and transportation strategy that takes into consideration current and planned transportation improvements and current and planned development projects in the Embarcadero area; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Task Force include representatives from Department of Parking and Traffic, the Transportation Authority, the Municipal Transportation Authority, the Department of Public Works, the Port of San Francisco, the Municipal Railway, the Fire Department and the Police Department and members of the public; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Task Force will be subject to the Sunshine

Ordinance and open meeting laws to ensure that residents, business owners and property

owners in the Embarcadero Area are aware of changes to the area and have the opportunity
to provide feedback on changes that are being explored.
