WHEREAS, Golden Gate Park is the cultural, recreational, and environmental heart of San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, Golden Gate Park is a world-renowned resource for the City and County's residents and visitors to the Park; and,

WHEREAS, The Golden Gate Park stables play an integral role in the history of the Park, as the stables were built in 1870 by William Hammond Hall, the original designer of Golden Gate Park and the first superintendent of Golden Gate Park; and,

WHEREAS, The Golden Gate Park stables are today used by youth, adults, and seniors from San Francisco and throughout the Bay Area as a riding academy, as a boarding facility, and as a recreational facility; and,

WHEREAS, The lessee of the Golden Gate Park stables' concession intends to abandon the premises described in their lease with the City and County on September 30, 2001; and

WHEREAS, The Golden Gate Park stables need substantial funds for capital improvements in order to continue providing its many services to the citizens of San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, Users of the stables, experts in veterinary medicine, competitive equestrians, teachers of equestrian riding, and managers of horse boarding facilities, along with the Recreation and Park Department, will be able to provide valuable input to the Recreation and Park Commission and to the Board of Supervisors on various methods of funding repairs and capital improvements on the stables; and,

WHEREAS, Such a group could also provide valuable input into the most efficient and effective method to repair and improve the stables; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby create a working group which shall be called the Golden Gate Park Stables Working Group and shall be subject to the Sunshine Ordinance; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the working group shall include:

- One (1) person who currently boards a horse at the Golden Gate Park stables,
- One (1) licensed veterinarian, who specializes in the medical treatment of horses,
- One (1) person who has experience in equestrian competition, or one (1) person who has previously taught equestrian riding,
- One (1) person who has a background in, and experience with, boarding horses
 and/or managing a boarding facility, and
- One (1) representative from the Recreation and Park Department; and be it FURTHER RESOLVED, That this working group shall meet on a regular and consistent basis in order to evaluate possible funding opportunities for capital improvement

needs at the Golden Gate Park stables, and to evaluate the most efficient and effective manner to repair and improve the stables; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this working group shall report any of its findings, concerns or recommendations to the Recreation and Park Commission and to the Board of Supervisors.
