Resolution Supporting passage of California Senate Bill 953, the California Integrated Care and Involvement Act of 2001.

WHEREAS, by the year 2030, one in three Californians will be over the age of 50 and one in six will be over 65; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco and the State of California face an enormous challenge and opportunity with respect to this historic aging of our population, and if we do not attend to this challenge smartly and immediately, it promises to become a huge crisis; and,

WHEREAS, our best hope for addressing this challenge and crisis must be grounded in a profound, positive, and pervasive change of our culture and its vision and attitude toward aging; and,

WHEREAS, SB 953 addresses issues faced by our aging state with a visionary, comprehensive strategic action plan for both the cultural and the policy and program dimensions of our aging population; and,

WHEREAS, SB 953 calls for the creation of a Statewide Age Diversity and Elder Involvement Campaign, a media and public education campaign designed to generate a cultural shift to a more positive vision and expectation with respect to how aging is viewed by Californians; and,

WHEREAS, SB 953 calls for the creation of a California Elder Corps within a Division of Intergenerational Relations to facilitate the service contributions of older adults into California civic life; and,

WHEREAS, SB 953 calls for an Integrated Human System of Care to ensure that elder services are made available consistently to every older adult in each local area and to provide

a streamlined Internet-based interface for the retrieval of no-cost information, advice, and basic planning regarding care options; and,

WHEREAS, the Integrated Human System of Care would engage the state in public and private partnerships to maximize existing resources and capacity building in the network of elder care and require that the study of gerontology be included in all associate of arts, bachelor, and graduate programs in the helping professions offered at public educational institutions; and,

WHEREAS, SB 953 calls for the development of high school course curriculum that would educate younger generations in financial preparedness; and,

WHEREAS, SB 953 calls for the Employment Development Department to biannually publish a list of all private and public California companies that provide elder benefits to employees and their immediate families; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the City and County Board of Supervisors support the passage of Senate Bill 953 and request the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to send a letter of support to SB 953 author, Senator Vasconcellos, and Governor Gray Davis.
