Resolution urging the Mayor's Office of Homelessness to explore the possibility of creating and implementing a centralized intake homeless management information system.

WHEREAS, There are currently twenty-two identified homeless service providers within the City and County of San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, There is currently no centralized management information system that can provide the necessary information to assess the true quantity and, most importantly, the true quality of the homeless services provided by these twenty-two providers; and,

WHEREAS, A centralized intake homeless management information system that would link together the many service providers could prove to be beneficial in this effort; and,

WHEREAS, Beginning in 2004, all homeless service providers that receive HUD SHP McKinney funding will be required to have such a management information system; and,

WHEREAS, The computerized data collection system offered by a management information system could capture system wide information over time about the characteristics and service needs of men, women, and children who experience homelessness in San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, A management information system could also improve and expand upon already existing data, protocols and procedures to coordinate service systems, streamline referral processes, enhance service delivery, simplify reporting, and provide much needed information for policy making; and,

WHEREAS, This computerized system could collect various types of reliable data that could very much benefit policy makers, including the following: unduplicated counts, length of

stay in shelters, demographic characteristic, income level and sources, benefit utilization and history, educational status and history, employment status and history, residential history, and geographic location of last residence; now, therefore, be it
