Resolution requesting that the City Attorney develop proposed transition management

plans for City elective offices.

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is governed by the following elective offices: Mayor, Board of Supervisors, City Attorney, District Attorney, Assessor-Recorder, Public Defender, Sheriff and Treasurer; and

WHEREAS, Effective transition from one officeholder to another is critical to the operation of City government; and

WHEREAS, The City and County has no formalized procedures governing transition and current methods employed vary from office to office; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED. That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby requests that the City Attorney, in consultation with current and former officeholders and their staff, the City Controller and other individuals with extensive local government experience, develop proposed transition management plans for each elective office of the City and County, commencing with the office of Mayor; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That such plans should present a summary of current law, recommendations and policy options based on interviews with the individuals identified in the preceding paragraph and transition plans in other governmental offices that could serve as models for San Francisco; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED. That such plans should include, but not be limited to, the following:

- Selecting a transition team; (a)
- Sunshine and records rentention; (b)

- (c) Hiring for key staff positions;
- (d) Exit interviews with outgoing officeholders and their staff; and
- (e) Recommended interviews with other City staff; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That with respect to transition to a new mayoral administration, a plan should include the following:

- (a) Department briefings;
- (b) Choosing commissioners;
- (c) Department director selection process; and
- (d) Critical timelines during the first six months of an administration; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the City Attorney, in responding to this request, to incorporate recommendations that constitute policy advice in the form of reports of interviews conducted; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors Board may, based on the City Attorney's report, consider adopting formal City policy for transition planning.
