Resolution authorizing the Department of Children, Youth and Their Families to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$300,000 from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) that targets Vietnamese and Central American newcomer girls between the ages of 0 to 18 in the Tenderloin and Mission neighborhoods.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Violence Prevention Project will engage two hundred girls and 50 caregivers through the planning process and a minimum of 30 girls will benefit from improved service delivery and participation in Youth Development Teams; and,

WHEREAS, The \$300,000 (\$150,000 per year over two years) Violence Prevention Project is a two year grant beginning October 1, 2002, and ending September 30, 2004, that will be administered by the Department of Children, Youth and their Families, with key collaborative partners including the Department of Public Health and members of the Gang-Free Communities Initiative; and,

WHEREAS, The goals of the Youth Violence Prevention Project are as follows: conduct a comprehensive, in-depth assessment of the strengths, capacities and needs of newcomer Vietnamese and Central American girls in the Tenderloin and Mission; increase awareness within the community and among policy makers of the service and support needs of newcomers girls and their families; design a unified approach to serving and supporting

San Francisco's newcomer girls that mobilizes and coordinates public, private and community resources; and increase resources to implement the initiative; and,

WHEREAS, The Department proposes to maximize use of available grant funds on program expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Evaluator for this project has been designated as Dr. Vivien Chavez, an Assistant Professor in the Health Education Department, College of Health and Human Services, San Francisco State University; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That any subsequent funds from SAMHSA for the Youth Violence Prevention Project will be appropriated through the Annual Budget Process; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco hereby authorizes the Department of Children, Youth and their Families to accept and expend the \$300,000 from SAMHSA.
