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3 **Resolution commending Log Cabin Ranch School and urging the Mayor's office of**
4 **Budget to ensure resources remain available to allow for the continued vitality of this**
5 **critical program.**

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7 WHEREAS, Log Cabin Ranch School is San Francisco's post-adjudication
8 incarceration and rehabilitation facility for juvenile male offenders who are committed to the
9 program by. The Judge of the San Francisco Juvenile Court; and,

10 WHEREAS, The Log Cabin Ranch program offers a unique opportunity to affect
11 change in the lives of young men, while helping them build the skills and abilities necessary to
12 avoid recidivating and to sustain positive life choices; and,

13 WHEREAS, Log Cabin Ranch is located 50 miles south of San Francisco, in the Santa
14 Cruz Mountains right in the heart of the beautiful redwood forest; and,

15 WHEREAS, This therapeutic facility is operated by the San Francisco Juvenile
16 Probation Department in partnership with many key stakeholders like the Department of
17 Public Health/ Special Programs for Youth, San Francisco Unified School District and a host
18 of individuals and community based organizations; and,

19 WHEREAS, All services are supported by curriculum, steeped with measurable
20 outcomes, accreditation and sustainable linkages for the youth back into the greater San
21 Francisco community for continued developmental enhancements; and

22 WHEREAS, Because of the continuing gang warfare and its disruptive impact on the
23 surrounding community, successful alternative rehabilitation facilities like Log Cabin are vital
24 to stemming the tie of violence and allowing young men to pursue positive choice in life; and,
25 therefore, be it

1 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby commend Log Cabin Ranch School
2 for the invaluable services it provides to rehabilitated incarcerated youth; and be it further

3 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urge the Mayor's Office of Budget to
4 ensure resources remain available to allow for the continued vitality of this critical program;
5 and further be it

6 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors will make preserving services at Login
7 Cabin Ranch a high priority during fiscal year 04-05 budget reviews.
