WHEREAS, The San Francisco Aging and Adult Services Commission states that with the passage of the Medicare Prescription Drug Plan, some seniors may soon be paying thousands of dollars per year for their medication; and,

WHEREAS, A coalition of public and private groups, including the Senior Action Network, the San Francisco Organizing Project, Bethel AME Church, and Planning For Elders, among many others, are waging a campaign to raise awareness about crucial issues surrounding prescription drugs; now, therefore, be it
