WHEREAS, The best time to plant a tree in San Francisco is during the winter months, from December to April, when there is a lot of rain; and

WHEREAS, On March 12, 2005, hundreds of volunteers will be planting trees in San Francisco with the goal of planting 5000 trees in the city this year; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby declares March 12, 2005 as Arbor Day in San Francisco.
