[Rescind FDA Sperm Donor Recommendations]

Resolution urging the Federal Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to rescind its policy recommendations for anonymous sperm donors which bar gay and bisexual men from being prospective donors, and further urging the FDA to adopt community recommendations to institute a non-discriminatory policy based on sexual behavior rather than sexual orientation.

WHEREAS, The Federal Food and Drug Administration (FDA) announced new policy guidelines that will take effect on May 25, 2005 which recommend prohibition of any man who has engaged in homosexual sex during the previous five years, from being an anonymous sperm donor; and,

WHEREAS, The FDA has repeatedly rejected community recommendations to adopt a non-discriminatory screening protocol that focuses on high-risk sexual behavior by potential donors, regardless of sexual orientation; and

WHEREAS, The FDA bases its latest recommendations on unscientific claims that all gay men pose a higher-than-average risk for carrying HIV; and

WHEREAS, The FDA recommendation would permit as sperm donors self-proclaimed heterosexual men who had unprotected sex with any man or woman who is HIV positive, but would prohibit from being sperm donors gay and bisexual men who are in monogamous relationships unless they were celibate for five years; and

WHEREAS, Although the FDA guidelines are not mandatory, sperm banks and fertility clinic throughout the nation have already instituted practices which decline gay and bisexual sperm donors; and

WHEREAS, The FDA recommendations are based not only on baseless scientific grounds, but are also repugnant for their overt and unnecessary exclusion of gay and bisexual men as viable potential donors; and

WHEREAS, The FDA recommendations pose a potential health threat in that the agency itself ignores the increasing risk of heterosexual transmission of HIV, especially in communities of color; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco condemns the discriminatory policy recommendations set forth by the Federal Food and Drug Administration barring gay and bisexual men from being anonymous sperm donors; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the FDA to adopt community recommendations to institute a non-discriminatory policy based on sexual behavior rather than sexual orientation in which prospective donors would be rejected if they engaged in unprotected sex in the previous 12 months with an HIV-positive person, an intravenous drug user or any individuals of unknown HIV status.
