[Supporting Gay Marriage AB849]

Resolution declaring support for eliminating legal discrimination against same-sex couples in the provision of civil marriage licenses and further supporting The Religious Freedom and Civil Marriage Protection Act, AB849 and further urging the Governor of California, Arnold Schwarzenegger to sign The Religious Freedom and Civil Marriage Protection Act to protect all families of California.

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has through local policy and ordinance historically shown its consistent commitment to fair and equitable treatment of all persons regardless of gender or sexual orientation; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Gavin Newsom sanctioned same sex marriages on February 10th, 2004 in the City and County of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is home to numerous families headed by same gender couples, many with children; and

WHEREAS, Assemblyman Mark Leno introduced Bill AB849 to amend current state law regarding marriage to a civil union between two persons rather than a civil union between a man and a woman; and

WHEREAS, California state legislature passed AB849 by a vote of 41-35 on September 6^{th} , 2005; and

WHEREAS, Both the United States Constitution and California Constitution clearly state that no laws will be made or enforced that abridge the privileges and immunities of citizens of the United States; and that no person within its jurisdiction will be denied equal protection of the laws; and

WHEREAS, The United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights guarantees the right to marry and found a family to "all men and women of full age"; and

WHEREAS, California law currently provides domestic partners with only some of the state rights available to married couples; and

WHEREAS, Independent studies prove that California would save \$25 million dollars a year in tax revenue if same gender couples were allowed to marry, and

WHEREAS, Providing equal access to civil marriage will not require religious institutions to perform or recognize marriages that conflict with their particular religious traditions or beliefs; and

WHEREAS, The opportunity to publicly and legally commit to share one's life with a person of one's choice is for many people one of the most central aspects of human experience; and the denial of marriage to same sex couples is a denial of fundamental human rights; and

WHEREAS, Denying civil marriage to gay and lesbian families deprives them of thousands of state and federal rights, privileges, immunities, protections, and responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, In February 2004, Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court ruled in "Goodridge V. Department of Public Health" that the government may no longer deny marriage and marriage rights to same sex couples because it is unconstitutional under the liberty and equality provisions of the Massachusetts Constitution, and

WHEREAS, In 2005, Canada and three other west European nations including Spain Belgium, the Netherlands have taken a leadership role in securing civil rights for gay individuals by legalizing same-sex marriage; and,

WHEREAS, Gay and lesbian families deserve the same rights and legal protections as other families under the law, including the protection of their spousal rights and privileges and protection of their children's economic interests by insuring their access to the resources of both parents; and

WHEREAS, Suffering the inability to access these legal protections results in significant harm to these families, including financial insecurity, lack of retirement and death benefits; and lack of access to family court for dissolution; and

WHEREAS, No resident of the City and County of San Francisco should be refused equal protection under the law; and

WHEREAS, Discriminatory civil marriage laws result, especially, in significant harm to lesbian, gay, bisexual; and transgendered people by perpetuating homophobia, just as anti-miscegenation laws barring people of different races from marrying, legal in the United States until 1967, perpetuated racism and social ostracism; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco declares its support for eliminating legal discrimination against same-sex couples in the provision of civil marriage licenses and supports The Religious Freedom And Civil Marriage Protection Act, AB849; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the Governor of California, Arnold Schwarzenegger to sign The Religious Freedom and Civil Marriage Protection Act thus protecting all families of California.
