[Urging Governor Schwarzenegger to grant Stanley Tookie Williams' request for clemency]

Resolution urging Governor Schwarzenegger to grant Stanley Tookie Williams' request for clemency and to support AB-1121, the "California Moratorium on Executions Act."

WHEREAS, Stanley Tookie Williams was convicted of 4 murders, committed during the course of 2 robberies, and is scheduled to be executed at San Quentin on December 13, 2005; and

WHEREAS, Williams admits to being one of the founders of the Crips street gang in Los Angeles, but maintains his innocence of these murders, and the Federal Appeals Court described several of the key witnesses who testified against him as informants with "lessthan-clean backgrounds and incentives to lie to obtain leniency from the state in either charging or sentencing;" and,

WHEREAS, Tookie Williams has written nine books for children and young adults aimed at stripping away the romanticized myths of gangs, crime, and prison, and presenting at-risk young people with an honest portrait of the dangers of gang life; and,

WHEREAS, Williams mentors teenage boys and girls incarcerated in the California Youth Authority, encouraging them to find positive direction in their lives and escape the CYA's 91% recidivism rate; and,

WHEREAS, Williams can serve as a teacher by example to at-risk children who are traumatized daily by violence, and will ultimately help guide children in a manner that authority figures may be unable; and,

WHEREAS, Williams' "Tookie's Protocol for Peace: A Local Street Peace Initiative" was signed by 200 members of the Crips and Bloods in Newark, New Jersey, which led to a

Mirkarimi BOARD OF SUPERVISORS significant decrease in the murder rate that had claimed 24 lives in the first four months of 2004, and,

WHEREAS, This year, Williams received The President's Call to Service Award, accompanied by a letter from President Bush praising him for demonstrating "the outstanding character of America;"

WHEREAS, Williams was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize and the Nobel Prize for Literature in honor of his anti-gang advocacy; and,

WHEREAS, Williams' repudiation of gang life and apology for the harm he has done provides the Governor with an opportunity to exercise the power of clemency to show that our criminal justice system is designed to rehabilitate—not punish; and,

WHEREAS, The death penalty has historically been disproportionately applied to African-Americans, who account for one-third of those executed, 43% of those on death row nationwide, and 67% of those on death row in the Federal system, even though African-Americans constitute only 13% of the American population; and,

WHEREAS, Since 1973, over 120 people have been released from death row based on evidence of their innocence, and future technological innovations will provide new tools for emancipating the wrongfully condemned; and,

WHEREAS, The California Commission on the Fair Administration of Justice is currently conducting a study of the state's criminal justice procedures aimed at examining the causes and prevalence of wrongful convictions and wrongful executions in California;

WHEREAS, The Commission will make recommendations and proposals designed to ensure the application and administration of criminal justice in California is just, fair, and accurate;

WHEREAS, Until the Commission makes its recommendations it would be inappropriate for the Governor of California to proceed with executions;

Mirkarimi BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco has endorsed a moratorium on executions in the United States in Resolution No. 632-00 and a moratorium on executions in California in Resolution No. 116-00; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges Governor Schwarzenegger to grant Stanley "Tookie" Williams' request for clemency; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges Governor Schwarzenegger to effect a moratorium on executions while California's death penalty procedures are reviewed and evaluated, by giving his full support tod AB-1121, the "California Moratorium on Executions Act."
