

1 [Grant funds to support the Aboveground Petroleum Storage Act program.]

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3 **Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health’s Environmental**
4 **Health Section (DPH-EHS) to enter into an agreement with the California Environmental**
5 **Protection Agency (Cal/EPA) and to designate a representative to sign the agreement**
6 **and any amendments thereto for implementation of the Aboveground Petroleum**
7 **Storage Act (APSA) and to accept and expend retroactively a new grant in the amount**
8 **of \$63,567.48 from CEPA to support the “Aboveground Petroleum Storage Act**
9 **Program;” for the period of January 1, 2008 through March 1, 2010.**

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11 WHEREAS, Cal/EPA awarded DPH-EHS \$63,567.48 to support the APSA program for
12 the period of January 1, 2008 through March 1, 2010; and,

13 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Public Health Department Certified Unified Program
14 Agency (CUPA) shall use these grant funds made available pursuant to California Health and
15 Safety Code, section 25270.11 and per the grant agreement, and any amendment, with the
16 California Environmental Protection Agency to implement the requirements of the
17 Aboveground Petroleum Storage Tank Act; and,

18 WHEREAS, An ASO amendment is not required, as grant funds equal to .50 FTE are
19 being used to partially support 12.9 FTE existing positions at DPH-EHS’s Hazardous
20 Materials Unified Program Agency (HMUPA) including 1 Sr. Industrial Hygienist (Job Class
21 #6139), 1.5 Industrial Hygienists (Job Class #6138), 4.5 Environmental Health Inspectors (Job
22 Class #6120), 5.9 Sr. Environmental Health Inspectors (Job Class #6122); and,

23 WHEREAS, A request for retroactive approval is being sought because the funder did
24 not send DPH-EHS the award letter until April 11, 2008 with a project start date of January 1,
25 2008; now therefore, be it


