[Major Encroachment - San Francisco State University - Pedestrian Tunnel Below Winston Drive]

Resolution granting a revocable permission to San Francisco State University (SFSU) to occupy portions of the public right-of-way to construct and maintain a pedestrian tunnel below Winston Drive to provide a safe and accessible connection from the main campus of SFSU to the site of a new Recreation Wellness Center; and making environmental findings, and findings of consistency with the General Plan and the priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1.

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Public Works Code Section 786, San Francisco State University (SFSU), requested permission to occupy a portion of the public right-of-way to construct and maintain a pedestrian tunnel below Winston Drive to provide a safe and accessible connection from the main campus of SFSU to the site of a new Recreation Wellness Center; and

WHEREAS, The land between the two campuses slopes steeply downward toward the campus on the south side of Winston Drive, with the elevation at the bottom of the slope approximately 24 feet below street level, and approximately 20 feet below the proposed project site on the north side of Winston Drive. The proposed tunnel will provide a gradual ADA-compliant walkway between the campus on the south, and the proposed site on the north side of Winston Drive as a gateway between the center and the main campus; and

WHEREAS, The encroachments are shown on plans filed with the Department of Public Works. Copies of such plans are on file in the office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 130523; and

WHEREAS, The Transportation Advisory Staff Committee (TASC), at its meeting of October 11, 2012 recommended the proposed encroachment for approval; and

WHEREAS, The Planning Department by letter dated October 19, 2012, found the proposed pedestrian tunnel to be in conformity with the General Plan, the Better Streets Plan and Planning Code Section 101.1 In the abovementioned letter, the Planning Department's Environmental Planning Section also determined that the proposed project is categorically exempt (Class 1-Existing Facilities) from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA, pursuant to CEQA Guideline Section 15301). A copy of said letter is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 130523, and is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, After a duly noticed public hearing on April 10, 2013, the Department of Public Works, on April 23, 2013, approved DPW Order No. 181211, which recommended approval of the proposed encroachment conditioned upon SFSU constructing a new sewer line and two (2) manholes below the Pedestrian Tunnel at its cost; and

WHEREAS, The permit and associated Street Encroachment Agreement, which are incorporated herein by reference and are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 130523, shall not become effective until:

(a) The Permittee executes and acknowledges the permit and delivers said permit to the City's Controller, and

(b) Permittee delivers to the City Controller a policy of insurance provided for in said agreement and the Controller shall have had approved the same as complying with the requirement of said agreement. The Controller may, in his discretion, accept, in lieu of said insurance policy, the certificate of an insurance company certifying to the existence of such a policy; and

WHEREAS, The Permittee, at the Permittee's sole expense and as is necessary as a result of this permit, shall make the following arrangements:

Page 2 5/28/2013 (a) To provide for the support and protection of facilities belonging to the Department of Public Works, San Francisco Water Department, the San Francisco Fire Department and other City Departments, and public utility companies;

(b) To provide access to such facilities to allow said entities to construct, reconstruct, maintain, operate, or repair such facilities; and

(c) To remove or relocate such facilities if installation of the encroachment requires said removal or relocation and to make all necessary arrangements with the owners of such facilities, including payment for all their costs, should said removal or relocation be required; and

WHEREAS, The Permittee shall procure the necessary permits from the Central Permit Bureau, Department of Building Inspection and/or Bureau of Street-Use and Mapping, Department of Public Works, and pay the necessary permit fees and inspection fees before starting work; and

WHEREAS, No structures shall be erected or constructed within said street right-ofway except as specifically permitted herein; and

WHEREAS, The Permittee shall assume all costs for the maintenance and repair of the encroachments and no cost or obligation of any kind shall accrue to the City and County of San Francisco by reason of this permission granted; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That pursuant to Public Works Code Section 786, the Board of Supervisors hereby grants permission, revocable at the will of the Director of the Department of Public Works, to San Francisco State University (SFSU) to occupy a portion of the public right-of-way to construct and maintain a pedestrian tunnel below Winston Drive to provide a safe and accessible connection from the main campus of SFSU to the site of a new Recreation Wellness Center.
