

1 [Donation of Obsolete Self Contained Breathing Apparatuses to City College of San Francisco
2 Fire Sciences Program]

3 **Resolution authorizing the Fire Department to donate 30 obsolete Self Contained**
4 **Breathing Apparatuses to the City College of San Francisco Fire Sciences Program.**

6 WHEREAS, City College of San Francisco is a leading educational institution for Fire
7 Sciences and teaches those who wish to become First Responders and Firefighters; and

8 WHEREAS, A large part of firefighting training focuses on manipulative skills and
9 simulated drills with the aid of genuine equipment; and

10 WHEREAS, Firefighting and Self Contained Breathing Apparatuses (SCBAs)
11 equipment is expensive and difficult to obtain; and

12 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Fire Department has recently purchased modern and
13 state-of-the-art breathing apparatuses, thus rendering thirty (30) SCBAs obsolete and surplus
14 property with very little value; and

15 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Fire Department wishes to donate thirty (30) retired
16 SCBAs for educational purposes; and

17 WHEREAS, These SCBAs would serve as a valuable teaching tool for donning and
18 doffing and fire drills, and City College would benefit from these devices as training aids; and

19 WHEREAS, On September 12, 2013, the Fire Commission adopted Resolution 2013-
20 04, Recommending that the Board of Supervisors Approve the Donation of Thirty Obsolete
21 Self Contained breathing Apparatus to City College of San Francisco; and

22 WHEREAS, The Fire Commission Resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
23 Supervisors in File No. 140698, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if
24 set forth fully herein; and


1 WHEREAS, Chapter 21 of the Administrative Code allows the City to dispose of
2 surplus commodities in a manner that will best serve the City's interests, including maximizing
3 the City's economic return on surplus commodities, maximizing the re-use of surplus
4 commodities by public entities, non-profit organizations and schools, and avoiding
5 unnecessary additions to the waste stream by maximizing the re-use and recycling of surplus
6 commodities; and,

7 WHEREAS, In donating surplus commodities, the Administrative Code specifies that
8 the first priority shall be to donate the commodities to public entities, non-profit organizations,
9 or private organizations serving the public and physically located in San Francisco; and,

10 WHEREAS, City College fulfills the criteria set in the Administrative Code for donating
11 surplus City commodities; now, therefore, be it

12 RESOLVED, That the Fire Department is authorized to donate thirty Self Contained
13 Breathing Apparatus to City College of San Francisco, for use in its Fire Sciences Program.


