#### **Regular Meeting**

The Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee met in regular session, in-person with remote access and public comment via telephone, on Thursday, June 8, 2023, with Chair Catherine Stefanie presiding. Chair Stefani called the meeting to order at 10:01 a.m.

#### 230469 [Liquor License Issuance - 2565 Mission Street - Arena SF]

Hearing to consider that the issuance of a Type-90 on-sale general music venue liquor license to Qualia Entertainment Inc., to do business as Arena SF located at 2565 Mission Street (District 9) will serve the public convenience or necessity of the City and County of San Francisco. (Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee)

04/14/23; RECEIVED. The applicant submitted a request for a determination on the public convenience or necessity of the issuance of a Type-90 on-sale general music venue liquor license to Qualia Entertainment Ins., to do business as Arena SF located at 2565 Mission Street (District 9).

04/21/23; REFERRED TO DEPARTMENT. Referred to the Planning Department and Police Department for recommendation.

05/18/23; RESPONSE RECEIVED. The Planning Department recommends approval. The site is located within the Mission RUSD as defined in Planning Code, Section 249.60. In this case the Zoning Administrator has determined that the Type-90 meets the intent of the Mission RUSD in that: The Type-90 can be approved for existing entertainment establishments that already have another license (Type-47, -48, etc.) without impacting their established land uses (i.e., Nighttime Entertainment, General Entertainment, Restaurant, Bar, etc.). 2565 Mission Street has been operating with a Type-47 on or before November 1, 1976, per the California ABC; the Type-47 has been in continual use since then; 2565 Mission Street has operated with an established land use of General Entertainment / Nighttime Entertainment. This operation has been operating prior to and continually since 1995.

- 1) Petitioner(s) shall actively monitor the area under their control in an effort to prevent the loitering of persons on any property adjacent to the licensed premises as depicted on ABC-253;
- 2) Entertainment provided shall not be audible at any nearby residence or consideration point; and
- 3) Between the hours of 7:00 pm and 2:00 am, or at any time the premises are providing entertainment, the petitioner(s) shall provide at least one (1) uniformed security guard(s) on the premises and shall maintain order therein and prevent any activity which would interfere with the quiet enjoyment of their property by nearby residents or the surrounding community; the licensed uniform security guard must be licensed by the State of California Department of Consumer Affairs.

A determination that the public convenience or necessity would be served was recommended by the committee.
