Thank you for your inquiry about CleanPowerSF, the City's community choice aggregation (CCA) program.

CleanPowerSF's goal is to provide electricity that is significantly greener and cleaner than the energy that residents and businesses in San Francisco currently receive at rates that are competitive with PG&E. Best of all, participation in CleanPowerSF is completely voluntary; consumers will be given four separate opportunities over four months to freely select who they want as their energy provider. We hope you will consider choosing the energy provider that offers the most stable rates and the cleanest, most renewable energy.

CleanPowerSF provides a choice for San Franciscans. Instead of one energy supplier, residents

and businesses will have a choice between two energy suppliers. Ultimately, the choice is yours; consumers will only benefit by finally having a real and meaningful choice in their electric energy supply.

CleanPowerSF will not cost the City taxpayers anything. The program will be funded entirely by participating ratepayers. PG&E will continue to bill energy customers in the City, but the generation component of the energy will come from CleanPowerSF. Our goal is that CleanPowerSF's rates be competitive with PG&E. Specifically, CleanPowerSF aims at providing two things that PG&E currently lacks - long-term rate stability and a cleaner energy portfolio.

CleanPowerSF will be administered by the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC), the City's water, sewer and municipal power utility. Dear San Francisco Board of Supervisors:

The Board appears to think that MUNI Pay is out of whack.

Some of the attack on MUNI Drivers is that they receive a \$3,000 Bonus. That seems to anger people.

If you gave \$3,000 to 35 Bus Drivers it would amount to \$105,000.

These 35 Firefighters below received \$828,000 in Bonus Pay or an average of \$24,000 each in 2010.

Why is there no visible outrage by the Board of Supervisors on these outrages bonuses by the SFFD?

What is Firefighter, SFFD BONUS Pay?

Below are 35 SFFD Chiefs.

The total OVERTIME costs for the 35 Chiefs was \$1,100,000. However they worked 16,000 hours at \$70.00 an hour to earn that amount. Each Chief's average overtime earning was \$32,000.

The BONUS Pay is giving money away. For the \$828,000 worth of BONUS Pay, not a single extra hour had to be worked. Each Chief averaged \$24,000 in BONUS Pay.

I have included a photo from the SFPL on the intersections in question, and a small publisher file on the image of Parkmerced and the prior Historic Photo in publisher format (microsoft) The time-frame for submission of comments was extended to March 12th 5:00pm per Mr. Cooper SF Planning Dept. for organizations that have not yet had the opportunity to provide input or have been notified of the indicated issues related to the impacts and need for cumulative solutions, a sincere "historic preservation" based alternative to a total demolition of Parkmerced, equitable density of development in ALL adjacent neighborhoods to help retain commercial cores, and retail existing, and more significant and sincere transit first policy through Tier-5 financing and open design competition on solutions besides the current proposed "road-widening" in the suggested solutions of this document, I strongly urge you to submit comments and require adequate action on this issue.

I have only done my best to highlight the concerns, and help initiate better comprehensive action on this issue for the district and planning process. The need to look at the future of this proposal, and initiate stronger more conceptual development proposals is dire and the need to place the inventiveness and creative foot forward extremely needed in the documents we have seen to date..

The Parkmerced EIR is scheduled as noted for April/May but this document is key towards the "better-neighborhoods-planning" process that will follow. Indicating the concerns on transit, and re-routing public transit through a residential neighborhood is a key mis-step currently proposed and should be vehemently corrected to route directly and straight in the shortest and soonest route possible to eliminate traffic/parking and congestion prior to development.

Dear President Chiu:

The Board of Supervisors is planning to discuss the charging of a fee to out-of-towners who want to visit the Botanical Gardens in Golden Gate Park. Seniors and children would be charged a lesser fee. Evidently, the Recreation and Parks Department approved the charging of such a fee. I wish please that the following be considered in opposition to such a fee for me and people like me who live in the Bay Area.

I am a retired employee of City and County of San Francisco. I live in Berkeley, from where I commuted to my job at City Attorney for some 17 years. Indeed, no one challenged my living outside of San Francisco, nor enforced a fee, when I worked for the City.

People who live in the Bay Area should not be considered out-of-towners. Many of us take part in City functions such as Opera and Symphony, and other cultural events as if we live in San Francisco. High rents, among other reasons, have kept me from moving back. I lived in San Francisco from the middle '50s to 1968 when I moved to Berkeley to attend the University of California. Nevertheless, I am a member of the major museums, and frequently visit them, including the de Young in Golden Gate Park. I have a library card with the Public Library in San Francisco. I frequently travel on MUNI. I have also periodically held membership in the garden club in the Botanical Gardens. I am in the park several times a month visiting favorite plants and trees, or attending the monthly plant sale in the park.

As a Bay Area resident, and San Franciscan in spirit, I hope the Board will vote "no" on the fee for people similar to myself. Thank you for your consideration.

What relevance does the dormers age have to do with illegal construction when there is no statue on illegal construction? The email did not state there was ever a conversation about the east side dormer with Inspector Ruiz.

The second issue the current illegal construction for the two dormers on the west side which far exceeded the scope of the permit, what relevance does the death of a building inspector Marvin Ruiz have to do with

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this illegal construction other than you refused to do your job by measuring these two dormers and you are allowing the owners of 767 North Point to construct illegal dormers and do not require them to pay the proper required fees to the city?

The San Francisco Chamber of Commerce, representing over 1,500 local businesses, urges you to sign into law ABX8 6 and ABX8 9, and in particular to sustain the \$400 million appropriation for transit operations. These bills will fundamentally change how transportation and public transit projects are financed while providing significant financial relief to the state's general fund.

We are keenly aware of the fiscal crisis facing the state that has forced you and the Legislature to explore creative solutions on how tax dollars are collected and spent. The City & County of San Francisco is also facing a severe budget deficit, including a \$45 million current year shortfall for MUNI. In San Francisco a critical component to our economic vitality is the mobility provided by our public transit system. It allows our residents to get to work and our kids to get to school. Our public transit system is also responsible for creating thousands of construction jobs and provides employment for drivers and mechanics.

While this proposal changes long standing public transit policy, it does provide immediate assistance to transit operators, including \$36 million for San Francisco, and provides an ongoing source for transit operations. This package also increases the state's investment in transportation projects, roadway maintenance and provides general fund relief by shifting bond debt payments to transportation accounts.

This package provides needed fiscal relief to the state while maintaining essential funding for public transit and local road maintenance. Therefore, we urge you to sign this package into law and to maintain the \$400 million appropriation for transit operations.

San Francisco Juvenile Probation Commissioner Dirk J. Beijen

Commissioner Beijen is a native San Franciscan, a veteran, a parent, a grandparent, and a retired San Francisco Police lieutenant. During a police career of more than 33 years, he worked in a variety of assignments -- most recently in the Investigations Bureau's Juvenile Section. In that capacity, he served as the officer-in-charge of the Internet Crimes Against Children Unit, as the officer-in-charge of the Youth Guidance Center Liaison, and as the liaison officer with the Community Assessment and Referral Center. Concurrent with those duties, he was in charge of the Police Department's Hostage/Crisis Negotiation Teams. He received numerous medals, awards, and commendations, and, more significantly, earned the respect of his fellow officers and the community members he served. Since the fall of 2000, he has been a teacher and mentor for students at the Life Learning Academy, a charter high school that serves "at risk" youth in San Francisco. He also serves our city's youth as a member of the San Francisco Police Activities League's Board of Directors.
