ORDINANCE NO. 53-01

[Library Fines and Fees]

AMENDING THE SAN FRANCISCO ADMINISTRATIVE CODE BY ADDING SECTION 8.21-2 TO AUTHORIZE THE LIBRARY COMMISSION TO CHARGE CERTAIN FINES AND FEES FOR THE USE OF LIBRARY MATERIALS AND SERVICES AND RATIFYING PRIOR FINES AND FEES.

Note: This entire section is new.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Chapter 8 of the San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding Section 8.21-2, to read as follows:

SEC. 8.21-2. LIBRARY FINES AND FEES.

(a) **Fee Schedule.** The Library Commission is hereby authorized to charge fines and fees for the use of library materials and services in accordance with the following schedule:

8 Section 2. The Board of Supervisors approves this ordinance
9 with the understanding that the agreement between the Public Library
10 and Unique Management Collection Agency for the recovery of
11 delinquent accounts will be implemented subject to the following
12 overriding conditions:-

- 13 1. The Public Library will mail to patrons second and third
14 notices of overdue library materials before referral for
15 recovery to Unique.
- 16 2. The second notice will indicate that a third notice will
17 follow, and that following the third notice, if the overdue
18 materials are not promptly returned, the matter may be
19 referred for recovery.
- 20 3. Telephone calls for recovery of materials will be made to
21 patrons only as a last resort, and shall be made only after
22 the Public Library has approved a script for the calls that
23 will not be offensive to patrons or to the City.
- 24 4. The Public Library will be responsible for ensuring the
25 expunging from the credit reports of patrons any statements
or information related to the recovery of library materials
that are inaccurate or inappropriate.

21 In addition, the Public Library is lowering the maximum number
22 of materials that a patron may have on loan from the Public
23 Library at any time from 75 materials to 50 materials.


