Section 1. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by amending Sections 2.26 and 2.27, to read as follows:

SEC. 2.31. ANNUAL ADJUSTMENT OF FEES.

Beginning with fiscal year 2003-2004, fees set in SectionS 2.26 and 2.27 may be adjusted each year, without further action by the Board of Supervisors, to reflect changes in the relevant Consumer Price Index, as determined by the Controller.

No later than April 15th of each year, the Police Department shall submit its current fee schedule to the Controller, who shall apply the price index adjustment to produce a new fee schedule for the following year.

No later than May 15th of each year, the Controller shall file a report with the Bourd of Supervisors reporting the fee new schedule and certifying that (a) the fees produce sufficient revenue

to support the costs of providing the services for which each fee is assessed, and (b) the fees do not produce revenue which is significantly more than the costs of providing the services for which each fee is assessed.
