

1 [Amending Subsections of Section 106 of the San Francisco Fire Code To Increase Fees For  
2 Services and Permits.]

3 **Ordinance Making Environmental Findings and Amending Sections 106.8, 106.8.2,**  
4 **106.12, Table 106-A and Table 106-C of the San Francisco Fire Code to Increase Fees**  
5 **for Fire Department Services and Permits, to Become Operative on its Effective Date or**  
6 **on July 1, 2006, Whichever is Later.**

12 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

13 Section 1. Environmental Findings. The Planning Department has determined that the  
14 actions contemplated in this Ordinance are in compliance with the California Environmental  
15 Quality Act (California Public Resources Code sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is  
16 on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 060780 and is  
17 incorporated herein by reference.

18 Section 2. The San Francisco Fire Code is hereby amended by amending Section  
19 106.8 to read as follows:

20 106.8 [For SF] High-Rise Inspection Fees. For inspections of high-rise structures  
21 pursuant to Section 13217 of the California Health and Safety Code, the owner of the  
22 structure shall pay a fee to cover the department's costs of inspection. Such fee shall be  
23 calculated on the basis of ~~\$8.00~~ \$8.50 per 1000 square feet of gross floor area, and shall be  
24 collected by the fire department.

1 Section 3. The San Francisco Fire Code is hereby amended by amending Section  
2 106.8.2 to read as follows:

3 106.8.2 [For SF] Notice of Payment Due. A notice of payment due shall be sent by the  
4 chief to the owner of the structure and shall contain the following information:

- 5 1. The date and location of the fire department's high-rise inspection;
- 6 2. The amount of the *gross floor area to be inspected and the* inspection fee;
- 7 3. A statement advising the owner of the structure that he or she is liable under this  
8 section for the costs of inspection in the amount indicated in the notice and that payment to  
9 the city to reimburse it for these costs is due within 60 days of the mailing date of the notice;
- 10 4. A statement advising that a penalty of 10 per cent plus interest at the rate of one per  
11 cent per month on the outstanding balance shall be added to the costs from the date that  
12 payment is due under this section;
- 13 5. A statement advising the owner of the structure that if payment of the costs is not  
14 received within 90 days of the mailing date, a lien may be imposed on the property of the  
15 owner of the structure pursuant to the provisions of this section;
- 16 6. A statement that the owner of the structure may appeal the square foot  
17 determination contained in the notice of payment due to the chief of department. Said appeal  
18 must be filed in writing with the fire department no later than 30 days after the date the notice  
19 of payment due is issued. The chief of department's decision on the appeal shall be final.

21 Section 4. The San Francisco Fire Code is hereby amended by amending Section  
22 106.12 to read as follows:

23 106.12 [For SF] Consolidation of Permits Fee. The fee for consolidation of permits  
24 shall be ~~\$40.00~~ \$90.00 for each activity added to the original permit.

1 Section 5. The San Francisco Fire Code is hereby amended by amending Table 106-A


