2 URGING THE MAYOR'S OFFICE ON HOMELESSNESS AND THE DEPARTMENT OF
3 HUMAN SERVICES TO CREATE A SYSTEM FOR TRACKING CRIMINAL MISCONDUCT IN
4 THE CITY'S SHELTER SYSTEM.

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6 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has a shelter system servicing
7 thousands of homeless people a year; and,

8 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has an obligation to make sure that
9 all City residents are able to enjoy their basic civil rights; and,

10 WHEREAS, The shelter system currently does not keep tracking data on the number
11 of sexual and other assaults as well as other forms of criminal misconduct taking place in the
12 shelters; and,

13 WHEREAS, The City must be committed to ensuring that our shelters are safe for
14 those who reside in them; and

15 WHEREAS, Safe shelters mean less people sleeping on the streets being subjected
16 to unsafe environmental conditions; and,

17 WHEREAS, There are reports sexual assault and other criminal misconduct in the
18 shelters; now, therefore, be it

19 RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the Mayor's Office
20 on Homelessness and the Department of Human Services to create a system for tracking
21 criminal misconduct in the City's shelter system.
