COMMENDING THE RECOGNITION OF BLACK HISTORY MONTH

WHEREAS, February is nationally recognized as Black History Month throughout the United States and various parts of the world; and,

WHEREAS, This recognition was originally known as Black History Week, initiated by noted African American scholar and historian Dr. Carter G. Woodson on February 12, 1926; and,

WHEREAS, Dr. Woodson also founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History, later renamed the Association for the Study of Afro-American Life and History, which has historically worked to conserve, preserve, and perpetuate African American history and culture; and,

WHEREAS, For several years the second week of February, which was chosen to coincide with the birthdays of Frederick Douglas and President Abraham Lincoln, was celebrated as a time to honor the contributions made to our communities, societies, nations, and the world by African Americans; and,

WHEREAS, The celebration was lengthened to include the entire month of February in 1976 as part of the United States' Bicentennial celebration; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco extends its highest commendation in recognition of Black History Month.




