2 AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKING AND
3 TRAFFIC TO APPLY FOR RETROACTIVELY, ACCEPT AND EXPEND UP TO \$1,495,000 IN
4 STP/CMAQ FUNDS AND UP TO \$100,000 IN REPROGRAMMED STP/CMAQ FUNDS FOR
5 VARIOUS TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS WITH REQUIRED LOCAL MATCHING FUNDS OF
6 207,000

8 WHEREAS, The United States Congress enacted the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st
9 Century (TEA21) in June 1998, which made available approximately \$14.4 billion in federal funds to
10 the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans); and,

11 WHEREAS, The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) will be reviewing project
12 proposals from the nine-county Bay Area region for compliance with federal and state rules and
13 regulations as promulgated by the Federal Highway Administration and Caltrans; and,

14 WHEREAS, In January 2000 the San Francisco County Transportation Authority adopted the
15 San Francisco Corridor Management Program that included the projects listed below; and,

16 WHEREAS, The Department of Parking and Traffic is requesting a TEA21 grant totaling
17 \$620,000 from TEA-21 Second Cycle STP/CMAQ Corridor Management Funds to make Van Ness
18 Avenue Pedestrian Safety Improvements including upgrading median islands and constructing sidewalk
19 bulbs; and,

20 WHEREAS, The Department of Parking and Traffic is requesting a TEA21 grant totaling
21 \$433,000 from TEA-21 Second Cycle STP/CMAQ Corridor Management Funds to widen the Stockton
22 Street sidewalk and remove a boarding island; and,

23 WHEREAS, The Department of Parking and Traffic is requesting a TEA21 grant totaling
24 \$442,000 from TEA-21 Second Cycle STP/CMAQ Corridor Management Funds to retrofit
25 BART/Muni Metro ventilation grates on Market Street to Improve bicyclists' safety; and,

1 WHEREAS, In March 2000 the San Francisco County Transportation Authority reprogrammed
2 \$100,000 in STP funds from the San Bruno Avenue/Bacon Street traffic signal project to the STIP
3 project to install various pedestrian crossing protection improvements including installing signs; and,
4 signal equipment, lighted crosswalks, and pedestrian signal countdown devices at pedestrian and
5 bicycle crossings at various locations; and,

7 WHEREAS, The Parking and Traffic Commission approved Resolution No. 109-00-PTC,
8 authorizing the Executive Director of the Department of Parking and Traffic to execute documents
9 necessary to apply for, accept, and expend \$2,895,000 of federal funds to implement five safety
10 projects, including the aforementioned projects; and,

11 WHEREAS, Indirect costs are ineligible according to Federal rules and regulations; and,
12 \$207,000

DM 12 WHEREAS, Under federal grant regulations, a local match totaling \$206,853 is required; and,

13 WHEREAS, The non-federal share of \$206,853 will be paid for with monies from departmental
14 and other non-federal funds; now therefore be it

17 federal Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century funds and up to \$100,000 in reprogrammed


