2 URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT, THE PLANNING DEPARTMENT  
3 AND ARNOLD PALMER GOLF MANAGEMENT TO FOLLOW THE DETAILED  
4 PROCEDURES OUTLINED IN SAN FRANCISCO'S LANDMARK INTEGRATED PEST  
5 MANAGEMENT PROGRAM FOR REDUCING THE USE OF PESTICIDES AND TOXIC  
6 CHEMICALS ON CITY PROPERTY.

7 WHEREAS, Arnold Palmer Golf Management, manager of the City's Harding  
8 Park and Fleming golf courses, is proposing the use of the pesticide Roundup as a part of  
9 the Palmer Company's plans to transform Harding Park into a world-class golf course;  
10 and,

11 WHEREAS, San Francisco is committed to ensuring public safety and  
12 environmental quality by significantly reducing the use of pesticides and other toxic  
13 chemicals used on public property; and,

14 WHEREAS, In 1997, as a sign of this commitment to reducing the use of pesticides, the  
15 City and County of San Francisco adopted the landmark Integrated Pest Management (IPM)  
16 Ordinance; now, therefore, be it,

17 RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the Department of  
18 Environment, the Planning Department and Arnold Palmer Golf Management to follow the  
19 detailed procedures outlined in San Francisco's landmark Integrated Pest Management Program,  
20 for reducing the use of pesticides and toxic chemicals on City property; and be it,

21 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the  
22 Department of Environment and the Planning Department to take all appropriate steps to ensure  
23 that all possible alternatives are explored before approving any exemptions for the broad-based  
24 application of the pesticide, Roundup.




