3 URGING THE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO ASSIGN NEWLY HIRED OFFICERS TO  
4 DISTRICT STATIONS.

6 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors authorized and the Police  
7 Department hired over 200 new police officers in fiscal year 1999-  
8 2000; and,

9 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors again authorized the hiring of  
10 another 200 new police officers in fiscal year 2000-2001; and,

11 WHEREAS, In 1994 San Francisco residents passed Proposition D,  
12 calling for full staffing of the Police Department; and,

13 WHEREAS, Many voters supported this measure because they wanted  
14 safer neighborhoods and more officers to patrol the streets; and,

15 WHEREAS, Police presence in the neighborhoods serves to deter  
16 crime; and,

17 WHEREAS, the San Francisco Police Department's practice of  
18 community policing is predicated on having more police officers  
19 assigned to neighborhood District Stations; and,

20 WHEREAS, Even after the hiring of new police officers, many of  
21 the San Francisco District Police Stations continue to be  
22 understaffed; now, therefore, be it

23 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County  
24 of San Francisco urges the Police Department to place a priority on  
25 District Stations when assigning newly hired police officers.
