2 AUTHORIZING THE PORT OF SAN FRANCISCO TO ACCEPT AND EXPEND TWO GRANTS
3 FOR A TOTAL OF \$481,000 FROM THE FEDERAL HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION'S
4 TRANSPORTATION ENHANCEMENT ACTIVITIES PROGRAM FOR THE HISTORIC
5 RENOVATION OF THE PIER 43 FERRY ARCH AND THE EMBARCADERO PROMENADE
6 PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENTS, AND FOREGOING THE REIMBURSEMENT OF INDIRECT
7 COSTS.

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9 WHEREAS, The Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century
10 created the Transportation Enhancement Activities Program to fund
11 Capital projects for Fiscal Years 1998-2003 that enhance quality-of-
12 life, in or around transportation facilities; and,

13 WHEREAS, Through the San Francisco County Transportation
14 Authority, the California Transportation Commission solicited
15 applications for the Federal Highway Administration's Transportation
16 Enhancement Activities Program; and,

17 WHEREAS, The Port of San Francisco submitted applications for
18 the Embarcadero Promenade Pedestrian Improvements and the Historic
19 Renovation of the Pier 43 Ferry Arch; and,

20 WHEREAS, The Embarcadero Promenade Pedestrian Improvements will
21 significantly improve the pedestrian environment in and around the
22 new Embarcadero Roadway transportation facilities by adding a
23 decorative railing consistent with other Roadway and Promenade
24 improvements; and,

1 WHEREAS, The environmental review for the Embarcadero Promenade
2 Pedestrian Improvements was included as part of the Environmental
3 Impact Report for the Mid-Embarcadero Roadway project, certified by
4 the San Francisco Planning Commission for this project on September
5 19, 1996; and,

6 WHEREAS, The renovation of the Pier 43 Ferry Arch will enhance
7 the planned ferry landing facility at Pier 43 and restore a
8 significant structure in San Francisco's rich maritime transportation
9 history; and,

10 WHEREAS, The renovation of the Pier 43 Ferry Arch is
11 categorically exempt from environmental review as per the California
12 Environmental Quality Act, Class 2, Guidelines Section 15302, which
13 states that replacement or reconstruction of existing structures or
14 facilities on the same site having substantially the same purpose and
15 capacity are exempt from environmental review; and,

16 WHEREAS, The California Transportation Commission and the
17 Federal Highway Administration approved \$481,000 in funding for both
18 projects on January 18, 2000 and March 23, 2000 successively; and,

19 WHEREAS, The grant terms prohibit including indirect costs in
20 the grant budget; now, therefore, be it


21 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion
22 of indirect cost in the grant budget; and be it

23 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Executive Director is authorized to
24 accept and expend \$481,000 from the Federal Highway Administration's
25 Transportation Enhancement Activities Program for the Embarcadero


1 Promenade Pedestrian Improvements and the Historic Renovation of the


