[Instant Run Off Cost] Resolution urging the Department of Elections and the Budget Analyst to provide pertinent information regarding the cost savings and other logistical specifics of instant run off voting to support the Board of Supervisors consideration of a charter amendment for the November 2001 ballot.

WHEREAS, San Francisco currently holds run off elections several weeks after regularly scheduled elections; and

WHEREAS, In the December 2000 run off election, voter turn out was as low as 16% in one Supervisorial district and in many districts turn out stood at roughly 30%; and,

WHEREAS, The cost of holding a second election is substantive and could be reduced with the implementation of an instant run off system; and

WHEREAS, With instant run off elections, instead of casting a vote for just one candidate for each office, a voter would vote for a first, second and third choice, The candidate receiving the fewest first choice votes would be eliminated from the race; and,

WHEREAS, This process continues until one candidate is left with a majority of the vote; and

WHEREAS, The full cost savings and logistical feasibility of an instant run off election system in San Francisco is currently unknown; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby urges the Department of Elections and the Budget Analyst to provide pertinent information regarding the cost savings and other logistical specifics of instant run off voting to support the Board of Supervisors consideration of a charter amendment for the November 2001 ballot.
