RESOLVED, By the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. It is hereby determined and declared that the public interest and necessity demand the financing of (i) the development of housing affordable to low-income households in the City and County of San Francisco and (ii) downpayment assistance to low and moderate income first-time homebuyers and all other aspects necessary or convenient for the foregoing purposes, that the estimated cost of \$200,000,000 is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City and County and will require the incurring of a bonded indebtedness.

Section 2. The estimated cost of \$200,000,000 is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City and County and will require an expenditure greater than the amount allowed therefor by the annual tax levy, and will require the incurring of a bonded indebtedness in the amount of not to exceed \$200,000,000.

Section 3. The Board of Supervisors having reviewed the proposed legislation, finds and declares (i) that the proposed project is in conformity with the priority policies of Section 101.1(b) of the City Planning Code and (ii) in accordance with Section 2A.53(f) of the City Administrative Code, that the proposed project is consistent with the City's General Plan, and hereby adopts the findings of the City Planning Department, as set forth in the General Plan Referral Report, dated May 17, 2001, and incorporates said findings by reference.

Section 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
