RESOLUTION NO. 519-01

[Street Vacation of a Portion of The Embarcadero.]

Resolution declaring the intention of the Board of Supervisors to vacate a portion of <u>on July 30, 2001 at 3:00 p.m.</u> The Embarcadero just north of Mission Street; setting the hearing date/for all persons interested in the proposed vacation of the street areas; and adopting findings that the vacation is consistent with the City's General Plan and Eight Priority Policies of City Planning Code Section 101.1.

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors, by Resolution 664-00, approved a joint project by the San Francisco Municipal Railway and Mission & Steuart Hotel Partners to construct a hotel at the northeast corner of Mission and Steuart Street, including the construction of an outdoor café in front of the hotel and along The Embarcadero; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Public Works has begun the process for the vacation of a certain street area, the general location and extent of which is a portion of The Embarcadero as further described below (the "Street Area"), and the San Francisco Port Commission, by Resolution No. 01-34, has authorized the Port's Executive Director or his designee to take all further actions necessary to complete such street vacation; and,

WHEREAS, The Street Area is shown in the Department of Public Works' SUR Map No. 7001, dated May 7, 2001, and is more particularly described in the legal description attached to such map, a copy of which map and accompanying legal description is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. <u>010811</u>; and,

WHEREAS, The Board recognizes DPW Order No.<u>172,952</u> recommending the vacation of the Street Area; and,

WHEREAS, The Street Area underlies a site that is designated for an outdoor café as part of the Mission-Steuart project pursuant to the Board of Supervisors Resolution No. 644-

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00 and San Francisco Municipal Railways' Municipal Transportation Agency Resolution 00-0066; and,

WHEREAS, The vacation of the Street Area is necessary to fulfill the objectives of the Mission-Steuart Hotel project; and,

WHEREAS, Subject to the reservations and conditions specified in this resolution below, the Street Area is unnecessary for present or prospective public street use; and,

WHEREAS, The public convenience and necessity require that the City reserve and except from the vacation of the Street Area solely the following: the non-exclusive easement for the benefit of the Department of Telecommunications and Information Services ("DTIS") and Pacific Gas & Electric Company ("PG&E"), in, upon, and over those certain portions of the Street Area in which their respective in-place and functioning facilities are located as described in the maps on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.

\_\_\_\_\_\_, to the extent necessary to maintain, operate, repair and remove such existing lines of pipe, conduits, cables, wires, poles, and other appurtenant structures, and existing facilities for the transportation or distribution of electric energy, and reasonable access to the foregoing facilities for the purposes set forth above; and,

WHEREAS, The public convenience and necessity further require that the Port grant to DTIS and PG&E the easements described in the preceding paragraph; and,

WHEREAS, The public convenience and necessity further require that any reserved or excepted easements for existing utilities described in the preceding paragraphs shall be terminated in whole or in part, as appropriate, upon the earliest of (i) the termination of the easement under an instrument (if any) executed by DTIS or PG&E, or (ii) the determination by the Director of Public Works or the Port's Chief Harbor Engineer (if within Port jurisdiction) that (A) reasonable alternative utility service has been provided to the areas served by such utilities for the period of service needed or (B) the areas served by the utilities no longer

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require such service (as may be evidenced by written notice of the owners being served that such service is no longer required); and that any new public utilities shall be placed in a dedicated street pursuant to then applicable franchise rights or other applicable requirements of controlling local, state or federal statutes, or otherwise in locations and on terms and conditions reasonably satisfactory to the City's Director of Public Works or the Port's Executive Director (if within Port jurisdiction), including without limitation, the location, term, width, scope, access rights and maintenance rights of the new utilities; and,

WHEREAS, Except as specifically provided above and subject to the conditions set forth below, the public convenience and necessity require no easements or other rights be reserved for any public utility facilities that are in place in the Street Area and that any rights based upon any such public utility facilities be extinguished upon the effectiveness of the vacation; and,

WHEREAS, Any removal, relocation or abandonment of any in-place utilities required or permitted to be performed in connection with the development of the outdoor café shall be done at no cost or expense to the Port or City (with the exception of DTIS,) provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to preclude any future owner or lessee of the Street Area from charging a private party for or otherwise causing a private party to bear the costs of such relocation where such charge or cost is otherwise permitted by law; and,

WHEREAS, The vacation of the Street Area shall be subject to satisfaction of the certain conditions precedent on or before the effective date of the vacation, as set forth below; and,

WHEREAS, On April 18, 2001 the Director of City Planning signed a letter, a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_, wherein the Director found that the proposed vacation of the Street Area is consistent with the

Municipal Transportation Agency BOARD OF SUPERVISORS City's General Plan, including the street vacation criteria set forth in the Urban Design Element, and with the Eight Priority Policies of City Planning Code Section 101.1; and,

WHEREAS, Before approving the vacation of the Street Area, the Board of Supervisors will consider the information contained in the Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the Mission-Steuart Hotel project certified by the Planning Commission on June 1, 2000, and make any findings required by the California Environmental Quality Act and applicable regulations; and,

WHEREAS, Section 787(a) of the San Francisco Public Works Code provides that the City and County will follow the procedure for vacating streets set forth in State law in the Streets and Highways Code and such rules and conditions as are adopted by the Board of Supervisors; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That under Public Streets, Highways and Service Easements Vacation Law (Streets and Highway Code Sections 8320 et seq.), the Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it intends to order the vacation of the Street Area, as described in the map referred to above on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the vacation proceeding of the Street Area is conducted under the general vacation procedures of Sections 8320 et seq. of the California Streets and Highway Code and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the vacation of the Street Area shall be conditioned upon and shall not become effective until (1) the Port's Executive Director has been authorized and directed to grant and has granted, and the Director of Property has been authorized and directed to accept and has accepted, an easement for the benefit of DTIS as described above, and (2) the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors has been authorized and directed to record (or cause to be recorded) a certified copy of the Ordinance ordering such vacation as

Municipal Transportation Agency BOARD OF SUPERVISORS provided in Section 8325(a) of the California Streets and Highways Code, and thereupon such vacation shall be effective without any further action by the Board of Supervisors; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That notice is hereby given that on the 30 th day of Ju1y, 2001, beginning at 3:00 p.m. in the Legislative Chambers of the Board of Supervisors, all persons interested in or objecting to the proposed vacation will be heard; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors adopts as its own and incorporates by reference herein as though fully set forth, the findings in the Director of Planning's letter referred to above that the proposed vacation of the Street Area is in conformity with the City's General Plan and is consistent with the Eight Priority Policies of Planning Code Section 101.1; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors adopts as its own and incorporates by reference herein as though fully set forth, the DPW Order No. \_ <u>172,952</u> recommending vacation of the Street Area; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors adopts as its own and incorporates by reference herein as though fully set forth San Francisco Port Commission Resolution No. 01-34, in support of the vacation of the Street Area; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit to the Department of Public Works a certified copy of this resolution, and the Board of Supervisors urges the Director of Public Works to publish and post this resolution promptly in the manner required by law and to give notice of the hearing of such contemplated action in the manner required by law.
