

1 [Approval to authorizing the Arts Commission to accept and expend a \$15,000 San
2 Francisco Urban Resources Partnership Grant for youth summer school landscape
3 improvement workshops at the Sunnydale Pump Station.]

4 **Resolution Authorizing the Director of Cultural Affairs of the Arts Commission to accept
5 and expend up to \$15,000 in federal funds granted through the San Francisco Urban
6 Resources Partnership which is administrated through the Natural Resources
7 Conservation Service, the forest service of the United States Department of Agriculture
8 and the Environmental Protection Agency, for the restoration of the Endangered Garden
9 Public Art Project at the Sunnydale Pump Station.**

11 WHEREAS, The nationwide Urban Resources Partnership (URP) program
12 established the San Francisco Urban Resources Partnership (SF-URP) in 1995; and,

13 WHEREAS, The URP program assists urban communities in improving their natural
14 resources, particularly soil and urban forests, and to develop greater cooperation among all
15 natural resource agencies, organizations and individuals; and,

16 WHEREAS, Pursuant to Section 3.19 of the San Francisco Administrative Code, the
17 City had allocated funds to construct the *Endangered Garden* Artwork for the Sunnydale
18 Pump Station Project, and had authorized the Commission to supervise and control the
19 expenditure of funds for this artwork; and,

20 WHEREAS, The Artist was selected by a selection panel appointed by the
21 Commission's Visual Arts Committee and approved by the Commission to create the
22 Artwork at the Sunnydale Pump Station Project; and,

23 WHEREAS, The Arts Commission through a series of meetings with the community
24 and staff from various City departments, determined that soil amendments and additional
25 planting should be performed on the Butterfly Meadow of the Endangered Garden, in

1 keeping with the artist's original intention to provide a restored habitat for other indigenous
2 plant species and wildlife; and,


3 WHEREAS, The SF-URP has recommended the award of up to \$15,000 to the Arts
4 Commission of URP: Forest Service of the United States Department of Agriculture funds
5 for soil restoration and planting at the Endangered Garden project at the Sunnydale Pump
6 Station.; and,


7 WHEREAS, The Department proposes to maximize use of available grant funds on
8 program expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be

10 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect in the
11 grant budget; and, be it

12 FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors does hereby authorize the
13 Director of the Arts Commission to accept and expend \$15,000 in state funds granted
14 through the San Francisco Urban Resources Partnership, and to execute any and all
15 documents necessary therefore.


