6 WHEREAS, K-Mart Corporation decided on June 28, 2001 to
7 stop selling hand gun bullets after extensive meetings with
8 survivors of the Columbine massacre; and,

9 WHEREAS, The Center for Disease Control and Prevention
10 estimates that 1.2 million children in the United States have
11 access to guns in their homes and that 34% of handgun owners
12 stored their guns loaded and unlocked; and,

13 WHEREAS, Accidental death of youth by hand guns account for
14 an astronomical portion of child deaths every year; and,

15 WHEREAS, Handguns are the number one killer of children in
16 California; and,

17 WHEREAS, The City of San Francisco should commend private
18 organizations that take independent initiative to promote gun
19 safety measures without government intervention; now, therefore,
20 be it

21 RESOLVED, That The San Francisco Board of Supervisors
22 commends K-Mart corporation for banning the sale of handgun
23 bullets in response to meetings with survivors of the Columbine
24 massacre.
