[Resolution in support of State Bill AB 1084.]

Resolution supporting AB 1084 to ensure that small contractors, including minorities and women owned businesses, have equal opportunity to compete for public contracts, and implements recommendations made by the Governor's Task Force almost a year ago.

WHEREAS, California state and local governments spend billions of dollars each year on the procurement of goods, services, information technology, and construction; and

WHEREAS, California small businesses comprise over 90 percent of all of the businesses in the state, employ more than half of the state's workforce and generate more than half of California's gross domestic product; and

WHEREAS, Small businesses are the principle source of new jobs in California's economy; and

WHEREAS, State and local governments have significant opportunities to promote small business development through public contracting; and

WHEREAS, The development of small businesses promotes competition and helps preserve the free enterprise system; and

WHEREAS, Many small businesses, including minority and women owned enterprises, continue to face barriers in accessing public contracting opportunities; and

WHEREAS, The enactment of Proposition 209 has had a particularly harmful effect on small minority and women owned enterprises; and

WHEREAS, AB1084, a bill pending in the state legislature, would create a microbusiness program for state agencies and expand local governments' power to promote small business participation in public contracting; and

WHEREAS, AB1084 would allow local governments to provide bidding advantages to small businesses and incentives to large businesses to subcontract with small businesses; and

WHEREAS, The passage of AB1084 would provide the City and County of San Francisco with more flexibility and tools to increase procurement opportunities to small businesses, including minority and women owned enterprises; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the California legislature to adopt AB1084 and provide local governments with more authority to increase small business participation in public contracting; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges Governor Gray Davis to support AB1084 and sign this bill into law if it is passed by the California legislature; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Mayor to take appropriate actions to help enact AB1084, including communicating the City and County of San Francisco's support of the bill to state legislators and Governor Davis.
