RESOLUTION NO. 649-01

[Resolution for the development of fuel cell technologies.]

Resolution urging the Public Utilities Commission and other applicable departments to facilitate development of a fuel cell energy program, to establish uses and applications of fuel cell technology that will enhance and improve the reliability of operations associated with San Francisco public buildings and infrastructure.

WHEREAS, California's energy crisis has resulted in the need to rethink the manner in which electric power is supplied to City facilities and services, due to the vulnerability of these facilities and services to grid failure; and

WHEREAS, The technology-based economy of San Francisco is more dependent than ever before on electricity; and,

WHEREAS, Electricity production supplying the grid is a major contributor to greenhouse gases, which have been linked to concerns regarding global warning; and,

WHEREAS, Alternative, environmentally friendly, power systems offer a clean, reliable, and quiet way to produce electricity that can enhance the reliability of our energy supplies while reducing greenhouse gases; and,

WHEREAS, Fuel cells can provide safe, reliable electricity in lieu of power supplied by the grid; and,

WHEREAS, Fuel cell technology can be deployed in distributed power generation configurations at the point of use and in combination with cogeneration applications combining heat and power systems; and,

WHEREAS, Fuel cell technology offers a viable means of providing safe, clean, silent, and reliable electricity for the buildings and services of the City's various agencies, departments, and enterprises; and,

Page 1 8/6/01 WHEREAS, The deployment of fuel cells can mitigate the detrimental effects of grid failure from overloading or seismic events and thereby decrease energy dependence as well as diminish vulnerability of City facilities to rolling blackouts and other failures of the electric grid; and,

WHEREAS, Fuel cell technology has been currently installed and reliably operating in regular commercial applications for over five years; and,

WHEREAS, Fuel cell systems exist with a proven commercial track record that have consistently achieved 90% or greater operating availability and have established service and parts support; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco desires to maintain the highest standards relative to the implementation and use of environmentally-sound operating practices and energy production technologies; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the expressed desire of the Board of Supervisors is as follows:

Section 1. The Public Utilities Commission and other applicable departments shall, with due diligence and in a timely manner, facilitate the definition and implementation of a fuel cell energy program.

Section 2. Evaluate the feasibility and cost-effectiveness of implementing fuel cell projects for a period of at least ten years to sustain reliable operations for City facilities and services.

Section 3. Identify for implementation fuel cell systems that have an established record of operational safety and reliability and incorporate remote operational control procedures and protocols.

Section 4. Procure and install fuel cell systems that meet or exceed specifications for operations in Seismic Zone 4.
