## RESOLUTION NO. 612-0

[Supporting Assembly Bill 540-Affordable higher education for immigrants]

Resolution urging the State Legislature to adopt Assembly Bill 540 authored by Assemblymember Marco Firebaugh, amending the state Education Code and the Uniform Residency Law which would allow California residents, regardless of citizenship status, financial aid benefits and "resident" fee status for the California Community colleges and the University of California systems.

WHEREAS, There are a large number of high school students who have lived in this country for most of their lives, and due to their citizenship status are precluded from obtaining an affordable college education because they are required to pay nonresident tuition rates, which are higher than those set for California residents;

WHEREAS, Many of these students and those who desire an education come from families with varied histories and legal identities, including legal and undocumented citizens; and,

WHEREAS, Many of these students and parents have contributed through their contributions and labor to the economic prosperity of this state, and accordingly have contributed to the vitality of our state universities and their financial assistance programs; and,

WHEREAS, Many of these students have already shown their academic eligibility by being accepted to these colleges and universities, and unfortunately have had difficulty in paying high tuition rates; and,

WHEREAS, A fair tuition policy for all Californians that includes immigrant students will increase the state's vitality and economic growth and therefore reinforce the states open and inclusive commitment to education for all its residents; and,

WHEREAS, Currently, residents who are not naturalized or are not identified as legal citizens may be admitted to state colleges and universities, but must pay a tuition higher than those of legal citizens and accordingly many of these students cannot afford such an education and are unfortunately lead to not pursing a higher education; and,

WHEREAS, These regulations are pursuant to the State Uniform Residency Law which establishes nonresident rates and rules for admitting legal and non-legal students to state universities and colleges; and,

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 540, authored by Assemblymember Marco Firebaugh would amend our state Uniform Residency Law to allow long-term California residents regardless of citizenship lower "resident" fee payments and financial aid benefits, which are now only given to legal residents of California; and,

WHEREAS, AB 540 will extend the bar to incorporate immigrants and provide equal opportunities for those who seek higher education within California; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby urges the California State Legislature to pass and Governor Gray Davis to sign Assembly Bill 540, authored by Assemblymember Marco Firebaugh; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this legislation be sent to our state representatives and His Honor the Mayor, with instructions that all actions be taken for the successful passage of Assembly Bill 540.
