3 Resolution commending Senator Martha Escutia on the passage of her bill SB 702,
4 California Environmental Health Tracking System, to track links between chronic
5 disease and the environment.

7 WHEREAS, Chronic diseases account for the majority of death, illnesses, and
8 disabilities in California and the United States; and

9 WHEREAS, While infectious diseases are the leading cause of death worldwide,
10 chronic diseases are now responsible for 7 of every 10 deaths in the U.S. each year with
11 economic costs totaling \$325 billion annually; and,

12 WHEREAS, By tracking and monitoring selected chronic diseases and their links to the
13 environment, the state will be able to: (a) determine the most effective strategies for disease
14 prevention, (b) assess the impact of disease to disabilities and premature mortality, (c)
15 measure effective prevention strategies, and (d) generate hypotheses that may lead to new
16 scientific knowledge about the cause of, and most effective ways to fight, chronic diseases;
17 and,

18 WHEREAS, Senator Martha Escutia introduced SB 702, California Environmental
19 Health Tracking System to track chronic disease link to the environment, and this bill was
20 passed and signed into law on October 5, 2001 which will require the California Department
21 of Health Services in consultation with the Office of Environmental Health Hazard
22 Assessment, to establish a working group of technical experts who can develop a tiered
23 approach to an environmental surveillance system ; now, therefore, be it
