RESOLUTION NO. 379-02

[Supporting a unified San Francisco School District]

Resolution supporting a unified San Francisco School District and urging educators, school administrators and community members to collaborate to improve educational opportunities for all City of San Francisco children.

WHEREAS, A proposal has recently been advanced <u>Any consideration</u> that would split San Francisco's Unified School District in half <u>into two districts</u> with hopes of increasing community involvement within the schools and ensure that all high school students can attend their own local school; and

WHEREAS, Such a <u>Any</u> division would polarize San Francisco racially and economically – segregating schools, increasing achievement gaps and reducing educational opportunities for San Francisco youth; and,

WHEREAS, This Any split would divide the entire city, not just the school system, and is a reactionary step which would delineate a system where the privileged are educated in well-funded classrooms while the disadvantaged attended inadequate schools; and

WHEREAS, The proposal <u>Any division</u> would inhibit and derail the progress the district has made in recent years; and,

WHEREAS, SFUSD is posting some of the highest achievement figures among the state's largest school districts (among California's 10-largest school districts SFUSD test scores rank No. 1 in math and 2nd and 3rd in every other subject); and,

WHEREAS, This proposal <u>Any division</u> reflects a negative approach to addressing city problems, encouraging those unhappy with public policy to insulate

themselves rather than working with others to ensure that the needs of all members of the community are met; now, therefore be it,

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby support a unified school district, not a divided one, and supports efforts to maintain diversity in our schools and achieve educational equity for all youth; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors supports a school district policy of parental choice, allowing all children access to any school in the district when possible, and also supports both the building capacity of "successful schools" and the reinvestment and rebuilding of poorer-performing schools; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges community members, civic leaders and educators to continue to build upon a record of success to further improve educational opportunities for all children from all communities.
