5 WHEREAS, The State of California has declared March to be Arts Education Month;

7 WHEREAS, San Francisco is known worldwide for its innovative, talented and rich arts

9 WHEREAS, San Francisco is committed to all its schoolchildren receiving a quality
10 education that recognizes all learning styles and strengths; and

11 WHEREAS, Studies show that teaching through the arts motivates children and
12 increases their aptitude for learning; that students of lower socioeconomic status gain as much
13 or more from arts instruction than those of higher socioeconomic status; that arts education
14 helps prepare engaged citizens for the future; and arts education increases interest in
15 academic learning, cognitive and basic skills development and the development of academic
16 achievement skills; now, therefore, be it

17 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
18 supports a high-quality, sequential arts education program for every student in every class at
19 every grade; and, be it

20 FURTHER RESOLVED, That March 2004 is Arts Education Month in San Francisco.




