[Delay local implementation of the State's cannabis identification card system.]

Resolution urging the Director of Health to delay local implementation of the State's cannabis identification card program until patients, advocates and City and State Legislators have sufficient time to petition the State Health Department to modify its card program protocols to better protect the anonymity of patients and caregivers, and physicians can be informed of their new obligations under the State card program.

WHEREAS, currently and for the past several years the City and County of San Francisco has been administering an identification card system for medical cannabis users and primary caregivers; and

WHEREAS, the City's identification card system provides that the City keeps no information identifying patients or caregivers; and,

WHEREAS, the City's identification card system requires that card applicants provide the Health Department with a verifiable recommendation from a physician; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to State law, the State of California has implemented a Statewide medical cannabis identification card system and protocols for the City's participation in that program; and,

WHEREAS, the State's program mandates City and State retention of information identifying patients and caregivers and requires that physicians submit specific forms to the Health Department, document the patient's need for medical cannabis in the medical record, and verify the recommendation to the Health Department within seven days of inquiry by the Department; and,

WHEREAS, the City's participation in the State-wide card program is mandatory and will result in the cessation of the City's card program; and,

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Page 1 10/25/2005 WHEREAS, the City has some flexibility regarding when it implements the State-wide card program but is scheduled to begin participation on November 7, 2005; and,

WHEREAS, patients and caregivers have expressed concerns that the State's program does not adequately protect the anonymity of patients and caregivers, and that the imminent implementation of the State's program does not provide sufficient time to educate physicians regarding their new obligations under the State program; and,

WHEREAS, delaying the City's participation in the State card program will afford advocates additional time to petition the State to modify its card program protocols to better protect the anonymity of patients and caregivers, and inform physicians of their new obligations under the State card program; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Director of the Health Department of the City and County of San Francisco to delay local implementation of the State's cannabis identification card program until patients, advocates and City and State Legislators have sufficient time to petition the State to modify its card program protocols to better protect the anonymity of patients and caregivers; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Director of the Health Department of the City and County of San Francisco to delay local implementation of the State's cannabis identification card program until physicians can be informed of their new obligations under the State card program.
